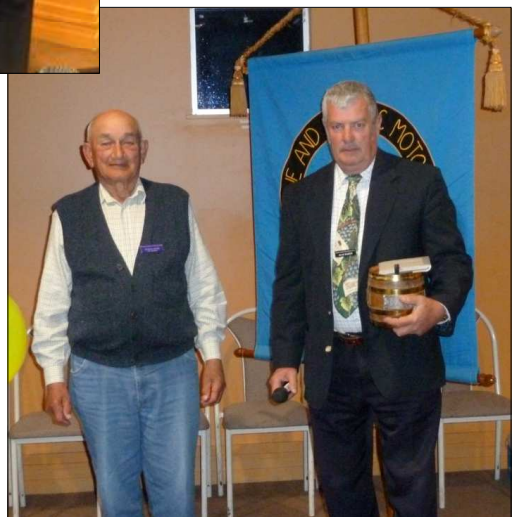

The 1st Australian Horse was a regiment of cavalry raised in New South Wales in 1897 and its first Half Squadron was formed in the Murrumburrah-Harden district. The men were provided from towns and districts around Yass, Goulburn, Bungendore, Michelago, Braidwood, Cootamundra, Gundagai, Gunnedah, Boggabri, Scone, Mudgee, Rylstone and Quirindi. The badge of the 1st Australian Horse was evidently designed by the unit's founder, Kenneth Mackay, and features the Australian symbols, fauna and flora, including the stars of the Southern Cross, and emu and kangaroo.

Lunch was enjoyed at the new Terracotta restaurant across the road from the old restaurant at Murrumburrah, the twin town of Harden. Members of the three Clubs travelled to Young where we inspected the amazing collection of Renault cars, signs, pictures, biscuit tins, oil cans and many other historical treasures that were beautifully displayed. Members of the Young Club provided us with a delicious home baked afternoon tea while members of the three Clubs chatted.

Several members had a very pleasant evening at the Young Services Club. On Sunday morning we travelled to Gooloogong via Grenfell which was a very pretty drive. The Christmas dinner was again scrumptious and the very talented dancers entertained us.

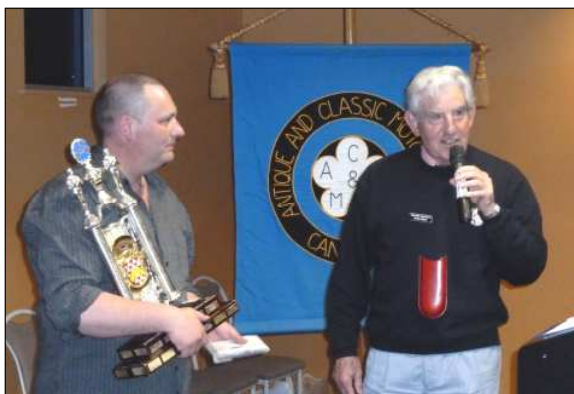

1928 STUDEBAKER COMMANDER REGAL SEDAN

At the club's trip to the Binalong Car Museum late last year, I recall saying to Chris Berry and Charlie Adams that I would like a classic restored earlier model car and preferably a car before say 1930. I still own the 1925 Oldsmobile tourer sedan which is housed at my Yass farm and whilst it is a well restored car, I was seeking an "upmarket" restored classic car.

In December's Just Cars issue I found the 1928 Studebaker Regal sedan for sale and in January this year Charlie Adams and myself visited the Sapphire Coast Historic Vehicle Club and after an inspection and a run in the car to the club's Pambula property and workshop, I purchased the car. The owner of the car was Tony Stove who is the President of the South Coast Historic Vehicle Club and Tony managed the total restoration of the car with the valuable assistance of the club members. Tony kindly agreed to trailer the car with available spares to my home in Canberra in early February.

A very interesting and comprehensive restoration report prepared by Tony Stove has been posted to the CACMC website under member restoration reports and due to the size of this restoration report will not be included in the Colonial issues. I am indebted to Tony for the detail of this report.

As everyone in the historic car movement knows there is always further restoration and improvements to be undertaken to most cars that have been restored and accordingly I have completed the following minor items :

Fitting of a nice black trunk and cover to the rear, received from Barry Boyce. Resealed the Pinion oil seal and repainted the engine. Prepared a two sided A frame display board of information including original manuals relating to this Studebaker model and fixed small suitable signage and club badges. John Jeffery brought back some window felt weather seals from Ralph Moore recently and these have been fitted externally. Whilst there may be other minor improvements to be identified, I am in the process of having a chrome grille fitted to the radiator for protection and presentation.

This car was presented to this years Wheels car show in March and was lucky enough to be awarded the Vehicle of the year award and the great efforts of Tony Stove and the SCHVC members are now

acknowledged. Also the Studebaker shared the award for the "Best American Marque" with Graham Boyce's 1930 Marquette which was very well presented and the Marquette also was awarded the restoration of the year. The Studebaker will be presented to the club's further events and car shows including this years Marques in the John Knight Park in Belconnen.

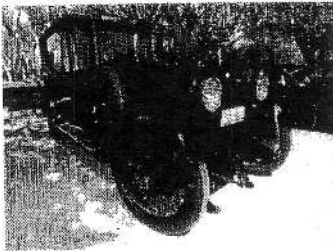
