But it was not until Peter and Ann invited club members to an open day to their Evatt property they realised how much collecting meant to the pair.

The invitation was sugar coated by Peter offering to put on a sausage sizzle for lunch.

Around 45 cars including a contingent of 11 from Yass assembled at Peter and Ann's property.

When they arrived it looked like an ordinary house in an ordinary Canberra street with a couple of cars out the front, a big BBQ trailer up the drive. The assembly of cars in the street also created quite a bit of positive interest from neighbours.

A walk and squeeze around the various carports was like an Aladdin's cave with every turn revealing more cars, more motor bikes, all under cover and beautifully restored or in the process of being restored in the fully equipped workshop.

Inside the house was a wonderland of memorabilia, everything from a bust of Marilyn Monroe to a skeleton of an orangutan gracing the hallway.

In one bedroom, taking pride of place on a wall was a cabinet of 32 stuffed birds. In another room a Navy ensign flag and in between maps, photographs, an old fashioned typewriter and big brass horn gramophone and a cabinet of butterflies, model cars, poker machines of the old pull handle type, bookshelves cramped full of volumes on motor cars and other subjects, a pair of boxing gloves, a Golden Fleece ram of the type that used to grace the top of service station petrol bowsers, and a mannequin complete with a pair of welding goggles. The list of items goes on, too numerous to mention.

Peter and Ann's passion for motor cars has extended to a Rolls Royce, a Riley and Ford GT. But Packards are still their main love, having recently purchased a Packard once owned by Hollywood movie star Lionel Barrymore, who won an Academy Award for his role in the 1930 film A Free Soul.

It certainly was a visit that opened the eyes of many members of what other club members collect.

Dennis and Margaret joined CACMC in early 1986, Dennis was Information Officer/Floor Member 1986/87. Together they were Events Directors for two years from June 1988.



Those of us who were on the Rock Rally remember their generosity in coming to Alice Springs to the rescue of Brian and Jill Carn whose Chrysler had to be sent home on a truck. The four continued the rally in the Morris' modern car.

We heard at Dennis' funeral how hard he and Margaret worked in the early days to set themselves up in life. There were wonderful tributes from their son Barry and grandchildren and great grandchildren. One grandson who lost his father paid a loving tribute to Dennis for the influence he had on his life.

Another interesting fact I learned was about Dennis' dancing prowess. I knew he and Margaret loved to dance and when they organised a presentation night, it included time and space for dancing.



Dennis always hoped we would get our own club premises and to this end he and Margaret organised coffee stalls to raise funds. Many members worked on these and the money we have in term deposits is still part of what was raised. At one event at Rodneys Nursery during Apple Blossom Festival (where our cars were parked among the plants) we sold ice creams, food and drink and raised \$900.

In recent years, Dennis and Margaret would escape to warmer weather on the Gold Coast. Margaret pass away there on 31 August 2010 and Dennis on 10 June 2013.

Listening to members after the funeral, I heard how Dennis and Lee Gaynor regularly visited Tony James in the later stages of his life. Dennis also kept in touch with Junia after Tony passed away. This caring nature was also mentioned in eulogies at the celebration of his life at Norwood Park Crematorium which was packed for the service.



It was hard to believe that Dennis was large as life on recent club runs and then there we were on 22 June attending his funeral. I hope the photo below (*thanks to G2*) of clubs members at the service demonstrates the esteem Dennis was held in the Club.

French won the 2013 Battle of Waterloo

The 2013 Battle of Waterloo between the French and British manufactured vehicles was won by the French.

At the beginning of the morning a thick fog descended around Lake Burley Griffin and seemed particularly thick around the Rond Terrace, at the bottom of Anzac Parade, where it was impossible to see the High Court building, New Parliament House or the National Library across the lake.

The early signs were that the British were in the lead as the French were not early risers, but as the morning wore on and with no sign of the fog lifting, the French continent took the lead and when the fog lifted around 11.45am they had streaked ahead.

There were some magnificent vehicles on both sides of the battle. Notably on the British side a pair of XK Jaguars a blue XK 120 and a red XK 140, MGs supported the event with more of the modern MGs than the traditional variety. A ZT MG sported a Ford Mustang motor as original equipment and attracted the attention of many on lookers – some nodding their heads in disbelief.

On the French side club members, Wayne and Sandra Smith's 1926 Salmson sports car attracted a lot of attention with members of the public photographing and seeking information about the vehicle from Wayne. The vehicle caused some confusion because the Salmson was manufactured in both Britain and France.

When the fog lifted it turned out to be a beaut day with a cloudless sky, sunshine and the temperature around 160.

A feature of the Battle of Waterloo is the raffle draw for bottles of the Arrogant Frog bottles of wine.

One of the things that surprised many exhibitors was that the cold and fog did not deter Canberrans from taking their Sunday morning constitutional on foot or bicycle, as a continuous stream of men, women, children and dogs strolled, jogged or pedalled on the paths around the lake foreshore during the morning, many stopping to admire the collection of French and British vehicles on display.

The final count was French 40 British 34.

NATIONAL TRUST CENTENARY OF CANBERRA RALLY 19-20 October 2013

Rally entry forms now available

Entry forms to participate in the once in a 100 years National Trust Centenary of Canberra Rally are now available and entry will remain open until 31 August 2013.

The rally vehicles will start at Jervis Bay on the morning of Saturday 19 October 2013 and travel via Nowra, Nerriga, Tarago, Bungendore and Queanbeyan in to Canberra. For those unable to start from Jervis Bay, options are available for starting at Tarago, Bungendore or Queanbeyan.

On Sunday 20 October the vehicles will muster at Exhibition Park in Canberra for a cruise down Northbourne Ave to the lawns of Old Parliament House for a static display of cars, commercials and motor cycles from the motoring pioneering days to the latest electric vehicles.

Entry is open to any vehicle whose owner is a member of a car club or the National Trust and the vehicle must be road registered.


'For people who wish to be involved but do not qualify, they will be most welcome to become a volunteer on either or both days of the event', rally organising chairman, Mr Scot McAlister said.

'This is a departure from the normal activities of the National Trust (ACT) but the Trust is as interested in Australia's moving heritage as much as historic buildings.'


