



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# Museum of the Long Weekend.

Spin Month, Canberra, Part 2.

Following on from the story about the **Nowra to Canberra Tour** part of Spin Month last magazine I present part 2.

Part 1 was about the cars, part 2 is about what they tow.

Many months ago Anne and I decided to join the Canberra centenary celebrations by joining a caravan event called the **Museum of the Long** 

**Weekend**, a weekend down by Lake Burley Griffin with 40 vintage caravans. We could have driven the 14km from Kaleen to Grevillia park, but decided to drive up to Cowra and join the convoy from other states.

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#### MACEDON RANGES GRAND TOUR - MAY 2010

My wife and I had made the 700 kms drive from Queanbeyan, NSW to Macedon, Vic the day before the annual Macedon Ranges Grand Tour, arriving well after sundown. Leaving so late from Queanbeyan (at noon) meant considerable apprehension while driving into the setting sun on the Hume and through kangaroo country between Broadford and Macedon.

Unfortunately the weather on Saturday 1 May 2010 did not match the forecast of '22 degrees with a light northerly': it was 'fine' but positively arctic! My son had driven up from Melbourne to join me in the TD for the Tour (he ended up doing all the driving – how did that happen!), which commenced with breakfast and briefing at the Gisborne Bowling Club.

Sixty cars (down in numbers from over 100 last year) were flagged off at 9 am. The route, about 200 kms on good secondary roads, took us over Mount Macedon then on to Romsey, Lancefield and Kyneton, where morning tea was available from a selection of cafés using a voucher system. From Kyneton we drove through Malmsbury to Hepburn Springs, where lunch was provided in the Pavilion Café. Then it was on through Daylesford and via Trentham to Hanging Rock, where we were directed to a reserved car park and pavilion for an excellent afternoon tea (even had cappuccinos!).

That evening there was a dinner for all participants, officials and other interested people – including the region's mayor – in The Old Shearing Shed, Campaspe Downs. The services of a renown chef from Kyneton were secured and he did not disappoint.

On Sunday morning a 'Show and Shine' was held in the park in Gisborne. The car that won the 'President's Choice' award was a professionally-restored Morris Minor 1000. This event coincided with the popular Gisborne Markets, so the cars on display garnered a lot of interest.

Following this event there was a pleasant drive to a local winery for lunch – also optional and the final planned event of the Tour.

I – and some of the Tour's organisers - had hoped that my TD was returning to the place of its birth; however, mine was not one of the 18 TDs built in Gisborne in the early-90s by TD Automotive Services; the first 100 or so (mine is No. 71) were built by Gason's in Ararat.

TD Auto entered two of their TDs in the 1995 Targa Tasmania and won their Class. Mine may have been the only TD 2000 to participate in the MRGT since its inception in 2003.

The Tour's 'featured marque' this year was the Austin Healey, of which there were five fine examples. Who knows - the TD might even by the featured marque one year if there's enough interest from local TD owners.

Perhaps some of our club's members will enter future Tours. I thoroughly recommend it.

# 1957 Chevrolet 210

Initially, General Motors executives wanted an entirely new car for 1957, but production delays necessitated the 1955-56 design for one more year. Ed Cole, chief engineer for Chevrolet, dictated a series of changes that significantly increased the cost of the car. These changes included a new dashboard, sealed cowl, and the relocation of air ducts to the headlight pods, which resulted in the distinctive chrome headlight that helped make the '57 Chevy a classic.

Fourteen inch wheels replaced the fifteen inch wheels from previous years to give the car a lower stance, and a wide grille was used to give the car a wider look from the front. The now favour '57 Chevy tail-fins were designed to duplicate the wide look in the rear. The Bel Air models were given gold rim ... the grille, front fender chevrons, hood, and trunk script were all rendered in anodized gold.

This car (Christine) was released in 1957 and manufactured in Janesville Wisconsin USA and sold for the sum of \$2,200. She is only one of her series that was produced totalling 651,358 of which is is No 225,209.

Christine spent most of her time in Nevada then shipped to Perth WA in 2007 before being delivered to Canberra in 2012. She gained her name affectionately as Christine because ...(she) ... from day one, tried to let me know she's the boss and continuously gave me trouble each time she was driven.

After eight months of constant attention I think she now knows that I'm taking care of her and slowing giving her the makeover she's been waiting for. Christine is now fitter that she's been in years having had many operations under the hood and a new interior giving her the nip and tuck to make her look young again.

#### Christine's vital statistics:

- \* 8 cyl 5700 cc Chevrolet engine with a 4 barrel Holley carburetor.
- \* Transmission: 3 speed Turbo 350 Auto
- \* New rack and pinion power steering.

Christine faithfully takes us far and wide to all types of car runs and shows, most recently Yarrawonga. She is proud to display herself as part of a drive-in cinema theme with both door trays adorned with burger, fries and Coke. To compliment this she has a set of original working speakers from the Sedalia drive-in from Missouri, which constantly plays 50s music which people seem to enjoy and on occasions onlookers stop to have a jive.

She may never be a prize winner any more but everyone seems to enjoy her rounded curves and the memories she brings to them.

# COOMA MOTORFEST

The bi-annual car show at the Cooma Showground was held on November 2 attracting (at my latest observation) 287 entries from as far away as Townsville. The humungous list of assorted vehicles was a tremendous eye-opener thrilling most people for a second—and for some—a third tour of the display. There are no special outstanding features at this event but for whatever reason it is one of the most enjoyable and entertaining car displays on the calendar which the Cancilliers and I have not missed for several years.

The drive to Cooma in the Monaro was enjoyuable taking 90 minutes. On arrival we were ushered into the allocated Monaros parking area. At a quick glance about 37 Monaros ranging from the HK to the HZs were in formation attracting mised opinions both from spectators and owners. It was very pleasing to see that most were in a factory standard condition.

The outstanding variety of cars, fire and army trucks, farm machinery, snow ploughs and stationary engines was unbelievable.

One car I particularly drooled over was an XM Falcon two door Futura with a striking sky blue flash over the white paintwork which had been meticulously restored throughout. This colour combination was a factory option in those days and I still remember a HT Holden taxi whose green flash had been resprayed white to conform with Aerial Taxis colour scheme. No question about it this Falcon had to be considered for the Car of the Show presentation.

There was also a Cobb and Co-built stage coach which served in the Snowy Mountains region until 1910 when the motor car took over passenger transport duties.

Another unusual vehicle was a Caterpillar scraper pwoered by a General Motors two stroke V8 diesel engine. I don't know if any reader has ever heard of this engine. I haven't.

There were also (very) limited trade stalls but nothing of any real significance to the old car buff.

By early afternoon anyone without a gazebo or an umbrella or not sitting in the complimentary marquees was roasting under the sun. Following the usual pleastantries with fellow CACMC members and other colleagues Vanda and I headed home zig-zagging to miss the abundance of road kill.

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# Transport Regulation Fact Sheet STOP Rego Labels

From 1 July 2013, light vehicles registered in the ACT will no longer be required to display a registration label.

Light vehicles are defined as those which have a gross vehicle mass (GVM) of up to 4.5 tonnes. Generally, this will include cars, light trailers and caravans, motorbikes and light buses.

The labels are no longer necessary as police can check registration by using on-the-spot camera technology.

Some states around Australia have already abolished the labels, with others considering doing so in the future.

All other aspects of the registration process will remain the same. You will still receive a registration certificate, and renewal reminders will continue to be sent six weeks prior to registration expiry.

You can remove your rego label from your light vehicle from 1 July 2013. However, it is not an offence to display a current or expired rego label.

**1974 Jensen Interceptor Mk3 Series 4**, VIN 2241/9746 Registration # ADK41V, NSW registered until October 2014. I bought it in November 2003 and the previous owner reported that he had also owned it for 10 years, so 2 owners in 20 years.

The main thing non-standard is remote control door locking/unlocking combined with engine immobiliser by Mongoose. Also the battery is not original of course (I had to replace the one it came with).

The engine is a standard 7.2 Litre V8. There were several problems when I bought it. One of the heads has been replaced. They are only available in pairs so I have a spare head. The brake master cylinder had to be replaced.

A rather tricky problem turned out to be the left electrically controlled window, which I knew about when I bought the car, and that has been fixed. I tried three times to do it myself before getting the professionals to deal with it! The windscreen wiper control switch has been replaced. Also, I have a spare pair of repeater flashers for the side of the car. That was a problem which turned out to be an electrical fault... The tyres are almost new, less than 100 Kms.

I've also had the odd bit of rust fixed and some parts resprayed. I have a box with loads of info and photocopies of parts manuals. I bought it for \$20,000 and It is now in very much better condition than it was 10 years ago. My asking price is something in the region of \$28,000.



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


