Council Delegate Roger Amos

Affiliation with Australian Confederation of Motor Clubs

Council president Mark Saunders, produced a business case for affiliating which was sent to club delegates electronically. The document provides details of those affiliated and its links to the NSW Government bodies and other motoring groups.

Council Treasurer indicated that there was around \$18 000 in the account.

The events director provided a list of events which again will be sent electronically to cub delegates.

The Council Registrar, Dave Rogers, brought up the matter of the 'grace period' which clubs allow members to pay their renewal fees before their membership is considered lapsed. The issue of which would be allowed under the law which is not contestable by insurers and lawyers. A month was floated but others believed 15 days is more appropriate.

Dave Rogers made the point the safest way is if you haven't renewed don't drive your CRS vehicle. Dave will research the issue and provide feedback.

Modified vehicles was raised in reference to one case seen at Wheels 2015 where its wheels were questionable as to whether they fell within the allowed modifications. The more general topic of allowable modifications was raised with the Morris Minor Club and the Model A modifications policy mentioned. Although these were never formally approved, the RTA indicated it was the type of policy which would be acceptable. All is in abeyance since.

Wheels 2015 – 816 stickers were handed out at Wheels but this included trailers and support vehicles. TADACT is thought to have made about \$3600. Wheels badges are still available. Out of the 100 ordered about 30 are left if any one missed out on getting one \$10 each. See Roger Amos.

Timing of the event was discussed and given accessibility to the site it was considered best to keep it the week before Skyfire. Access to King's Park on the Saturday before Skyfire is restricted when organisers are trying to set-up.

Reports are being prepared by various organisations for the Governments review of the motoring industry by a Senate Enquiry. The. Confederation of Australian Motor Sport (CAMS) had a submission prepared by Ernst and Young, which has a lot of data relating to the financial and employment assets of motor sport. A copy will come via the Council Secretary. The Australian Historic Motoring Federation, and the Council of ACT Motor Club will probably be making submissions to the enquiry.

19TH APRIL MONTHLY RUN

The 88 hectares (250 acre) fine Merino wool property of Glen Lynne, owned by Sandra Southwell-Stephens was the Club's destination for the April run.

Located off the Barton Highway on Spring Range Road, the run attracted 25 vehicles, one motor bike and around 30 people.

The property boasts a small museum of memorabilia of military equipment, farm machinery, and household goods.

A collection of 1000 thimbles and dolls house crockery attracted the attention of the ladies.

Sandra runs the property, which carries 500 fine Merino wool sheep, almost single handed, and has a busy life apart from the farm. She has been foster caring, mainly babies, for 37 years and was awarded an OAM in 2007 for her dedication to this important work. Sandra confesses that she has lost count of the number of babies she has fostered over the years.

Sandra is also chief steward for the sewing section at the annual Royal Canberra Show. Her association with the show goes back more than 43 years.

She is a descendant of Thomas and Mary Southwell of Sussex England who arrived in Australia in 1838 and took up 7000 acres of land in the district. Over the years the large property has been subdivided and handed to children and grandchildren.

The property once had a gold mine which has not been worked since the turn of the 19th century. Sandra recalled that a large number of Chinese worked the mine and her grandfather gave them an acre of land to grow their vegetables on.

The run was also the celebration of two member's birthdays - Brian McKay (86) and Charlie Adams (80) which was cause for the Club's choir to give a shaky rendition of Happy Birthday.

The run was organised by event committee member Chris Berry who met Sandra at a church fete, where she volunteered that there was a small museum on her property and would welcome a visit from the club.

Chris presented her with a certificate of appreciation for opening up her house and property for club members.

CRAFTSMEN AT WORK

Those of you who have seen Geoff Pritchard's 1972 MGB GT will know that it's distinctive and a "looker". Those who have driven it know it feels like a new car, tight and responsive. Geoff purchased the car from the third owner in Bathurst. The original owner purchased it in Australia but took delivery in England where she drove it around. Returning to Canberra it was later purchased by a Jerrabomberra resident. The car was serviced at times by the now defunct Morwood Motors.

Geoff has made considerable improvements to the vehicle to improve its usefulness and drivability. He seems to have a new improvement or maybe "bling" added every month if not weekly.

A huge step in the car's refurbishment came with a holiday in Crookwell at Sydney Restorations. What a skilled professional company they are. Tim (the owner's son) took charge of the restoration work and was meticulous in his attention to detail.

Initially the job was to replace some rusted front wing portions and rear doglegs, with any other rust to be removed. Some minor cosmetics were also undertaken but as we all know once you start something else always crops up.



An example of what is hidden away, other problems were more evident as some of the later photos show.

Geoff, Joe Micallef and myself visited Sydney Vintage Restorations to take some parts there during the refurbishment. What would normally be a simple hand over the counter the parts ended up as a pleasurable hour or so looking at the projects in the workshop and inspecting progress on Geoff's car. Tim showed us the parts cut out of the car and some of the finished panels. The main body of the car was in the paint shop where it was being hand rubbed in preparation for the final paint job.

Sometime later Geoff received a call to say the car was painted but they weren't happy with it and the paint supplier agreed so it was redone. It's good to meet a professional who has pride in their work.







The car is now back home and is awaiting the paint to fully harden (about a month) before it gets on the road again. Just a glimpse of the finished car but it's better seen in the flesh.

1970 BI-CENTENARY RALLY

Hi Helen

I have been reading the handbook for the 1970 Rally and found these Stories of Good Luck very interesting.

The rally was "The 1970 Bi-Centenary International Veteran & Vintage Rally for cars and motor cycles". It started in Sydney, came to Canberra for 3 days and ended in Melbourne.

It was the tenth annual international rally of veteran and vintage vehicles and coincided with the Bi-Centenary of Captain Cook's Voyage of discovery of Eastern Australia.

There were 292 Vintage cars, 209 Veteran cars and 38 motorbikes. There were 120 different makes of cars, including 46 Ford Model "T" and "A's", 28 Rolls Royces and 24 Vauxhalls.

Coralie and I were living in Owens Flats in Lyneham at the time and I can remember the old cars driving up and down Northbourne Avenue making lots of noises from engines and horns.

THE LUCK OF THE VETERAN GAME

A chance call at a Queensland country home in 1957 meant the difference between finishing a veteran run and the end of the road for a 1911 Metz.

Competing in the 1957 Gold Coast Rally from Brisbane to Surfers Paradise, 60 veteran cars were approaching Southport with the Metz at the tail-end of the field.

Keeping to the edge of the bitumen, the Metz struck disaster when it hit a large hole and the near-side wheel was smashed. The wooden artillery-type wheel was wrecked beyond repair and the driver seeking assistance, ran to a house 100 yards away.

After the driver explained the accident, the lady who opened the door enquired if the car was a Metz.

The somewhat astounded driver assured the woman it was and told her it was the only one of its marquee in Australia.

But another surprise was to come. The woman told the driver not to telephone. "I'll give you a spare wheel." She produced a Metz wheel from under her house and also offered a spare engine.

The driver and the Metz arrived in Surfers Paradise just before sunset, the car sporting three grey wheels and a black one.

The owner of a rare French veteran car found a treasure chest in a disused tumbledown shed standing beside the road in outback Australia.

The veteran, a 1909 12 horsepower, one cylinder Sizaire et Naudin, needed a radiator to complete its restoration. Laying in the open for many years, the French model had had its timbers ravaged by bushfire before the restorer stumbled across it.

The radiator was constructed of cast iron and was not easily obtainable. A friend of the owner-restorer, touring the countryside with a caravan, was asked to look out for the elusive item.

Stopping beside the road one night, the caravanner could not sleep and decided in pre-dawn hours to investigate the disused shed near his camping ground.

Shining a torch around the shed, he was jolted when he saw, reposing against a crumbling wall, a radiator and engine for a Sizaire et Naudin. Both were loaded into the caravan and the little French roadster once again became an automobile in reality.

This information came via the Club website from someone who I will only refer to as Steve as he does not want his name mentioned. I would be interested to know if any member looked at these and decided to acquire. Ed.

I am aware of the location of three vehicles, all of which currently reside in paddocks within the local area.

They are:

- A. An unrestored truck with a wooden tray of approx four metres in length. I estimate that the truck is from the 1940s. The truck has a trailer attached to it, with the trailer including a sign which advertises a business. The truck is located 18.2 kms from the Queanbeyan Leagues Club towards Bungendore, on the Kings Highway. It is on the left as you travel to Bungendore. Phone 62380077 and 0409 326 648.
- B. A similar truck abandoned in a paddock beside the Barton Highway. The vehicle is located 5.5 kms from the Murrumbateman service station, on the right as you travel towards Yass. The nearest cross street is Gounyan Rd.
- C. A mid-sized vehicle which appears to be an early Ford Cortina sitting for sale in a paddock beside the Hume Highway, around 5.5 kms from the Big Merino, Goulburn. The car is on the left as you travel to Canberra. There is no phone number visible on the car, however the word Garanga and the number 19397 are on the gate to the property. An internet search for "garanga goulburn" resulted in a death notice in the Sydney Morning Herald of 17 February 2014 for Walter Brown of Garanga, Yarra. (Yarra is the area which includes the Garanga property). The notice states that Mr Brown's wife was named Kerrie. There is a K Brown listed in the white pages at 19397 Hume Highway, Yarra, phone 0427 297 822. 1. The property numbers in the white pages and on the gate are identical. 2. The deceased and the holder of the phone listing have the same surname. 3. The phone listing is under K Brown (the wife's name is Kerrie) and 4. The reference to Yarra in the death notice and the phone listing. I believe that I have correctly identified the holder of the phone number for 19397 Garanga as Kerrie Brown.

There is also a faded blue Morris Minor sedan standing in the yard of a house at Murrumbateman. The house is the last on the left as you travel to Yass. The property on which the house stands is named Woodside.
