

HISTORY YOU MIGHT NOT KNOW

Hours after Pearl Harbor was bombed on December 7, 1941, the U.S. Secret Service found themselves in a bind. President Franklin D. Roosevelt was to give his Day of Infamy speech to Congress on Monday and although the trip from the White House to Capitol Hill was short, agents weren't sure how to transport him safely.

At the time, Federal Law prohibited buying any cars that cost more than \$750, so they would have to get clearance from Congress to do that, and nobody had time for that.

One of the Secret Service members, however, discovered that the US Treasury had seized the bulletproof car that mobster Al Capone owned when he was sent to jail in 1931. They cleaned it, made sure it was running perfectly and had it ready for the President the next day.

Al Capone's 1928 Cadillac V-8 "Al Capone" Town Sedan became the President's Limo in December 1941.

Mechanics are said to have cleaned and checked each feature of the Caddy well into the night of December 7th, to make sure that it would run properly the next day for the Commander in Chief. And run properly it did. It had been painted black and green to look identical to Chicago 's police cars at the time.

To top it off, the gangster's 1928 Cadillac Town Sedan had 3,000 pounds of armour and inch-thick bulletproof windows. It also had a specially installed siren and flashing lights hidden behind the grille, along with a police scanner radio.

AEROPLANES AND MODEL-A FORDS

A few years after the end of World War 2, several of us students at the University of Manitoba landed summer jobs, driving tourists around the mountains in Alberta's Banff National Park. Our travel west was by train, a trip which none of us had taken since pre-war days. You can imagine then our surprise and curiosity when we spotted along the way, bright yellow aeroplanes, parked in farmer's yards. Where on earth had these come from?

Our enquiries unearthed an interesting story. After the war, the Canadian government ended up with an assortment of unwanted training aircraft - planes such as Avro Ansons, Cessna Cranes, Fairey Battles etc. These had been used in the Commonwealth Empire Air Training Scheme which had trained so many young Aussies. Kiwis. Canucks and others for flying duties in the war in Europe. After hostilities ceased, Canada disposed of this surplus at auction, with many aircraft (usually minus propellers) selling for as little as \$100. Prairie farmers, always with a keen eye out for cheap useful parts bought many of them: dismantled bits were used for such things as wheels for trailers, cockpit perspex for barn windows, wiring in houses and aircraft bodies for chicken coops! Propeller feathering devices even found application in 'ham' radio operations (for remote antennae rotation to improve short wave signal strength). Thus, many uses for the parts, but what an inglorious end for these fine old machines! I wonder what remains could still be lying about on those prairie farms?

Anyway, once in Banff, we found our employer had a range of vehicles for us to drive – seven passenger Dodges with plexiglass roofs, Plymouth sedans, and Ford cars and buses. An older 1941 Cadillac four door convertible which had been sparingly used during the war, was also on hand; however, this unfortunately was not for us, but was in storage at the back of the company's garage.

During the height of the summer tourist season, we were on continuous call to show visitors around the region. Generally these customers were Americans, although a few other nationalities were also present; most were staying at the nearby luxury Banff Springs Hotel. On a fine sunny day, with towering snow-capped peaks, and with deer, bear, mountain sheep and goats out in force, we could easily earn a \$25 tip – a considerable amount in those days!

Now, amongst our workmates were the usual characters, but one of them, a good friend of our group, especially stood out. He was a very popular chap with the ladies, having many Banff and Calgary domiciled girl friends whom he 'entertained' in his 1930 model A (see attached). Unfortunately, during the summer this old car made just too many trips down to 'the big smoke', and finally one of the main bearings burned out, leaving a trail of oil down the highway. Our friend was now in the market for something more modern, and offered me his now defunct Ford for \$35, a price I just couldn't refuse!

Subsequently, several of us (all very rank amateur 'mechanics') set to work and removed the Ford's oil pan, and with crowbar leverage, identified the rear main bearing as the worn out culprit. Then we disconnected this bearing's bottom flange and sent it off to a Calgary machine shop, with instructions to re-babbit it back to original 'specs'. We had it back within a week, and (with new gaskets) bolted everything back together again. Surprisingly, we found the old girl ran rather well, and she served as basic personal transport for several of us for the rest of the season. But what mechanical brutality; only a tough old Model A engine could stand up to such crude workmanship!

It certainly was a fun summer - more like a holiday than work!

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
