

# Morris Registers 20<sup>th</sup> Biannual Rally – Warrnambool Victoria

Warrnambool in Victoria was the host city for the 20<sup>th</sup> bi-annual Morris Registers Rally held over Easter 2016.

Around 110 vehicles and 214 people registered for the event with many travelling great distances from Queensland, NSW, Victoria, South Australia and the ACT being some of the states and territories from which entrants travelled. A full range of Morris cars and commercials attended, the oldest being a 1916 Morris Cowley complete with a mine occupying the rear seat.

All agreed the 20th Rally was a great success with a variety of runs, entertainment and dinners to attend.

Rally headquarters was the Warrnambool Race Club where there was a never edging supply of tea coffee and biscuits provided.

The Good Friday run took entrants to Hopkins Falls a run of around 20 kilometres or to Middle Island to view the little penguins who live and breed on the island. Due to a rising tide it was not possible to cross to the island.

Dinner was at the Warrnambool Greyhound Track, with a courtesy coach transporting entrants to and from the venue. The feature of the evening was the Easter Bonnet parade where some extravagant head wear was on show.

Saturday the event took entrants to Port Fairy on the Great Ocean Road. Parking was arranged right next to the Port Fairy Easter Fair market. From the market we travelled to Woolsthorpe for a sandwich lunch provided by the Ladies Auxiliary.

Then it was back to Warrnambool for dinner at the Warrnambool Racing Club where the guest speaker was local character and chicken farmer, Swampy Marsh, who gave an entertaining, and enlightening address on his early days as a racing car driver and the fight with the Warrnambool City Council to save the penguins on Middle Island from the roaming foxes.

By using Maremma (Italian bred) sheepdogs, Swampy, found that the foxes would not cross the waterway to the island. Without the protection of the dogs the penguin numbers were reduced at one stage to less than 10, however with the dogs patrolling and barking whenever a fox came in to view they soon began to breed again and numbers are up around 180.

Sunday was the main display day and was held at the Flagstaff Hill theme park. Entrants were encouraged to dress in the period of their vehicle and some people went to extraordinary effort to dress up for the occasion. The dress code for the Sunday night dinner was formal and a delicious meal was served at the Warrnambool Memorial Bowls Club.

For those entrants not departing for their home on Monday, an optional run to Timboon was organised.

Vehicle judged best car was awarded to a 1938 MG VA Tickford Drophead coupe.

Rally Director John Habgood remarked that successful rallies are really about entertainment.

'Rally organisers are really in the entertainment business,' he said. "While the cars are an important part of any rally, it is the runs and events which makes or breaks an event," he said.

The 21<sup>st</sup> Morris Registers Rally will be held on Queensland's Fraser Coast, centred on Hervey Bay at Easter 30 March -2 April 2018.

Due to oil leaks on the MG Magnette the Gittins travelled modern. We covered more than 2000 kilometres on the trip without incident, however, some lowlife stole our GPS from the car.

#### **CACMC Presentation Night 13 August 2016**

Did you know that you can make recommendations to the Management Committee for the following awards. Your input is appreciated by the Committee to help us make decisions. We will start making our decisions at our June and July meetings so the earlier you get your suggestions in the better. Please forward them to the President, Secretary or Events Director.

#### 12. CLUB TROPHIES

CACMC encourages the restoration, preservation and use of antique and classic motor vehicles. To this end it offers awards to members who contribute to these activities. These awards are of two types, those that are awarded on the basis of the quality of the vehicles and those which recognise contributions to the operation of the Club.

All awards are decided by the Management Committee on the recommendation of various groups or individuals.

#### 12.2.2 Bill Southwell Encouragement Trophy

To be awarded to a young, inexperienced or keen member who has achieved a high standard of restoration so far and deserves recognition for his or her efforts. It should take into account setbacks in restoration, and difficult conditions with which to work, such as moving house, additions to the family, and work or family responsibilities.

#### 12.2.5 Bill Phillips Roaming Ambassador Award

Presented to a Club member who promotes goodwill within the antique vehicle movement in the Canberra region, who spreads goodwill when touring or goes out of his/her way to welcome members of visiting vehicle clubs.

#### 12.2.6 Hard Luck Trophy

Awarded to someone who has just had plain bad luck resulting in setback of restoration or use of an old car. To include bad luck on a personal side such as a house burgled. motor accident, health problems or even divorce.

#### 12.2.7 Fossicker's Award

A person always attending swap meetings, trading parts, etc. Perhaps the lengths that a person goes to in order to obtain parts or a complete car. One who passes on information to other members.

#### 12.2.8 Colonial Award

Recommended by the editor for the best article or the most contributions to the Colonial.

The Committee may from time to time make other awards for outstanding contributions by Club members.

Club members are encouraged to recommend to the Management Committee recipients for the Bill Southwell Trophy, the Henry Le Grande Award, the Bill Phillips Award, the Hard Luck Trophy and the Fossicker's Award. Although there is no mention of Colonial Award, I am happy to receive any suggestions.

Just a reminder to those members who had their vehicle judged by the Club Registrar and Examiners at Wheels that By Law 12.1 also includes:

"In order to be eligible for the trophy the vehicle must have attended three official Club events in the twelve months prior to the Presentation Night at which the awards are to be made."

#### **AMENDMENT OF BY-LAW 10**

"10. VFHICLE TRAILER

To offset the costs of registration and insurance and maintain the CACMC vehicle trailer in good condition members using it are required to make a contribution. The contribution is \$15 for each use plus \$5 per 100 km or part thereof. Any damage caused during use must be paid for by the member unless determined otherwise by the Committee. Proof of membership must be provided when borrowing the trailer. The member borrowing the trailer is responsible for compliance with all road regulations."

The Committee wish to amend the first and second sentences of By-Law 10 by leaving out a set figure. The contribution was amended some time ago to take into account rising costs but we neglected to amend the By-Law.

Proposed "To offset the costs of registration and insurance and maintain the CACMC vehicle trailer in good condition members using it are required to make a contribution as determined by the Committee and advised in the Colonial."

A vote is to be taken at a coming general meeting.

They are an amazing couple who gave us 4 days of their time to show us Lisbon and made sure there was nothing we needed. We enjoyed every moment and words cannot thank them enough.

I know other members of our car club have also met them and had the same warm welcome we received. What wonderful ambassadors for our Car club on the other side of the world.

The next morning Alex picked us up at 6.45am dropped Ana at school and then we said goodbye at the airport.

Some other motoring moments of interest as we travelled further throughout Europe:

Barges on the Danube carry the owner's car on the back. When they dock they are either driven or lifted off. I guess the boat is their home and one has to garage one's car somewhere!



In Amsterdam the bikes of course rate a mention; we passed a five story bike parking station. They are chained everywhere and we were told they drag 12000 a year out of the canals after the local ferals have thrown them in. Many bikes carry a number of people, a kid in front (like the old postal bike rack) and one behind. I also liked one where



the guy was pedalling and the lady sitting side-saddle on the bike rack behind- side saddle, not a tandem. He would have been working hard. No one bothers with bike helmets although in most places there is a dedicated bike lane, they don't share with cars. Even motorbikes use the

bike lanes.

At Rudesheim in Germany we saw a museum that had mechanical musical instruments. Some amazing ones particularly from the 1800's. Even the museum itself was interesting as it was a knight's house that dated from 1300. The car outside the front is a Nash.



We chose to do a bike ride along the bank of the river to the next village, about 12km. The bikes were old and well used and they had lights that were generated by

rubbing along the edge of the tyre. It was a very pleasant ride. Such a pretty place with the trees turning. Excellent bike paths here. The pictures are not good because we were moving at such speed! Michael was trying for a great photo but all he got was my back tootling along in front.

In Budapest, I couldn't resist this picture. The car is a Trabant (*next page*) This is the only car you could buy in the 1990's (Looks like a 60's car) if you lived in Hungary under the communists. It cost 5000 euros. You had to pay the full amount when you ordered it, and **5 years later**, it was delivered.

The delay was because the Russians used your money to invest in that 5 years, not because cars were scarce. You were not allowed to buy any other car even if you had the money. You did have a choice of colours though, so long as it was blue.



This is only a very small extract of the diary. When someone asked me what the best part of the trip was - it was all amazing. On reflection though, although the experience, history and places were out of this world, it was the people that made it memorable. Meeting family again (mine are in Ireland) and catching up again with the friends we share our journeys with, are the richest part of our experience.

Our special thanks to Alex and Manuela for their hospitality and kindness. To see a city and country with friends who are natives of that country is a whole different experience than that of mere tourist. **We cannot thank them enough**.

The cars were drawn up at the start of the walkway to the main reception building so that patrons entering from the carpark would see them as they walked along to the building. By this time it was fairly dark.


