President's Report

This is most likely be my last report to you as President of the Canberra Antique and Classic Motor Club. I have held this position for the past four years and it is time, I feel, that another member take up the reins. I have had a wonderful time in the club particularly as president and can only hope that I can continue to enjoy the good company, excellent outings that have been a feature of the club since I joined.

Financially the club is in a strong position, not nearly enough to contemplate our own clubhouse/ museum at this time but we are definitely not in any financial difficulties.

Being a member of the club has allowed has allowed me to re-kindle my passion for motor vehicles and to enjoy driving them on outings. I intend continuing to do so. We have managed to support quite a few community events as well as our monthly outings so the club can be quite active for people wishing to participate.

I wish to thank the committee and members for their support and patience over the time I have occupied the presidency – I offer whatever assistance I can to the new president and the incoming committee members.

All Management positions will be declared vacant later, so please consider what you, as individuals members can do to help the club keep functioning.

Treasurer's Report

The Club remains in a strong financial position however, since there are no immediate plans to introduce new spending I recommend that the fees remain the same for next financial year.

The club has increased assets by nearly \$6,500 over the 2013/14 financial year but this is in part to the greater proportion of members who have paid prior to 30 June compared with last year.

Payment by credit card is still used by a large number of members however, the costs in Treasurer time (due to double processing) and merchant fees (\$232.85) is noteworthy. An increasing number of members are using direct credit which requires less processing time and no cost from the bank.

I would like to thank Bob Judd who did the Treasurer's work during my long absence this year. I will be in the same position this financial year and expect to be away at the busiest period again. As such I will not be seeking nomination for Treasurer.

I have tremendous support from the Committees over the years and helped during absences by members including: Joe Micallef, Roger Amos, Helen Phillips, and as mentioned Bob Judd. Thanks to all.

The Club's auditor Gail Boate, has assisted me over many years as has audited the books as short notice at times. Thank you Gail for your help, advice and contribution to the Club.

I have done the Treasurer's job for over 15 years on and off (mainly on) and, as like most of the Committee, I feel it is time for others to step up and take on the management of the Club. New management members are needed to hopefully provide new ideas and relieve the present committee members who have served for a number of years.

Several issues need addressing:

- What the Club intends to achieve with its funds; and
- How better to manage the Club members records to reduce the amount of duplication of data entry.



Rare French Vehicle in Canberra

The return of a 1924 Cottin et Desgouttes motor car from the spray painter, looking resplendent in its maroon body and black mudguards livery was a welcome sight for club member Wayne Smith..

The French built car has been under restoration for around five years, since Wayne purchased the rare vehicle from a deceased estate in Melbourne in 2010. It has been at the Robinson Bros Panel beating near Lake George for the past 16 months.

Dave Robinson has made and installed new guards, repaired body work and painted the car.

Next on the list of thing to do include: - The upholstery, woodwork and the design of a cocktail cabinet, for the very roomy rear compartment. Wayne is going to build the cabinet and is at this stage unsure about the upholstery.

Sole Australian Concessionaries for Cottin et Desgouttes was Lawrence Morton & Co Pty Ltd, 353 Flinders Street Melbourne, who invited people 'if in town to ask for a demonstration.'

In a road test conducted by *The Australian Motorists* September 1 1923 reported:

'Altogether the Cottin et Desgouttes is a very pleasing car. Fast and possessed of a good acceleration, is yet quite docile and nice to handle.

'Economy in running, and ease of maintenance and quite feature of the car and the price at which it is sold makes it a very enticing proposition. "

Wayne has not put a final date for its first public appearance, but the return of the car to its Macgregor garage has Wayne's adrenalin and enthusiasm pumping to finish the vehicle.

The Cottin shares garage space with another French vehicle, which belonged to Wayne's father a 1926 Salmson, and a 1954 Austin Healey.

Technical details of the Cottin:

1924Type M 12 Horsepower

Four cylinder 2613 cc engine

Bore and stroke 80 x 130 mm

Twin ignition magneto and coil/distributor

Four speed gearbox and big four wheel brakes.

The Cottin et Desgouttes will be a welcome addition to the vintage car fleet in the ACT when it fully restored.

PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE CANBERRA ANTIQUE & CLASSIC MOTOR CLUB INC – New Membership Application Requirements

The Present Situation

Our Constitution currently requires Applications for Membership to be endorsed by a Proposer and a Seconder and then to go through a process that can take, at best, two complete months before approval is granted. For a new member, wishing to get their car put onto concessional registration, this can be a very frustrating waiting time.

Reasons for Change

At present, very few applications are received with the Proposer and Seconder details completed. Even when these sections have been signed, the applicant is rarely genuinely known by either the Proposer or the Seconder. Furthermore, Applications lodged electronically simply cannot be "signed" by a Proposer and Seconder.

In this day and age, this is an outmoded requirement that even now we are treating as being redundant. As such, this requirement should be simply removed.

The second concern comes about due to a fear that an Application will be received from someone who may be considered by some members to be unworthy of membership. Should this prove to be the case, adequate provisions already exist within the Club's By-laws (Part 4 – Cessation of Membership) to facilitate the removal of a member. Therefore, this requirement is a double-up of a safety mechanism that results in Applicants suffering an undue delay in accessing their membership rights.

The Proposed Changes to the Constitution


The following is the extract from our Constitution showing a mark-up of the current words, which the Committee believes, will provide the wording to accomplish the proposed changes:

- "5.3 Application for Membership
- 5.3.1 Persons wishing to become members shall complete such application forms and comply with such conditions as are specified in the By-laws in force at that time.
- 5.3.2 Every applicant for membership must have a proposer and seconder, both of whom should be members. The acceptance for membership shall be dealt with by the Committee, at least 2 weeks after publication of their application in "The Colonial" (insert) "as quickly as possible".
- 5.3.3 Any member who objects to any applicant becoming a member should appear before the Committee and/or state in writing their reasons for so objecting. In the latter case, the letter should be in the hands of the Secretary at least three days prior to the meeting.
- 5.3.4 (Change numbering) Any applicant approved by the Committee may become a member of the Association on payment of a nomination fee and the annual subscription or lesser subscription as determined by the committee from time to time."

Proposed Constitutional changes will be discussed and voted upon at our Annual General Meeting on 13 September 2016. Any proposal to change the Constitution requires the agreement of at least 20 financial members and a 75% majority vote at a Special or Annual General Meeting.

Council Communique – August 2016

Official complaint received from RTA about club members Offering their vehicles for hire

It has been brought to the attention of the Road and Traffic Authority (RTA) in the ACT that car club members are advertising their vehicles for paid hire for school formals and weddings.

Most advertising is through social media.

Unless the vehicle is accredited to be used as a hire vehicle and the driver holds a W classification on their driver's licence it is illegal and an offence under section 75 of the Road Transport (Public Passenger Services) Act 1999 for a person to pretend to be accredited to operate a hire car service for reward.

The RTA have advised that inspectors will be actively attending end of year formals to check unlicensed vehicles participating in end of year school formals. Additionally the Authority will be contacting people who place advertisements on social media websites who are not accredited, but advertising their services.

Such behaviour reflects badly on the car club movement and anyone found to be not abiding by the rules and regulations concerning hire vehicles should be ashamed of themselves and their club should take appropriate action to discipline them.

It is not illegal to use a CRS registered vehicle to take friends and relatives to school formals and weddings provided **no fees are charged**.
