

## Temora Aviation Museum - 'Warbirds' Trip 17,18 September

On Saturday 17 September five member's cars met at Temora after an early morning trip along the beautiful Burley Griffin Way. Unfortunately, it was a small group of members and partners following the late withdrawals of two cars. Early spring showed the countryside at its best and the vistas of large fields of golden canola against the green of spring were really beautiful.

The aviation museum demonstrates its commitment to excellence in engineering and maintenance in its every aspect. Car clubs are common visitors and there was large turnout of Rolls Royces and Fords, including an Edsel with the numberplate 'Lemon'. The static display planes are in beautiful condition and included a Canberra Bomber. Of course it is all about the air display and we were treated to fine weather as we watched five planes being put through their paces by the volunteer guest pilots. The absolute highlight was of course seeing and hearing the Spitfire, the roar of the supercharged Rolls Royce Merlin V-12 is very distinctive [27-litres (1,650 cu in) capacity of British grunt]. We are lucky to have such a museum, which holds two airworthy Spitfires when there are apparently only 50 remaining in the world that are capable of flying. After the air display we were able to enter the maintenance hangars and ask questions of the maintenance engineers.

Temora is a beautiful and tidy regional town and is worth a visit in its own right. After the air display we drove the 60 kms to Junee to stay in cabins at the Tourist Park. We ate out at a local club and were treated to the semifinal win by the Raiders!

The following day it rained; we visited the Junee Roundhouse, at one time the largest railway workshop in the Southern hemisphere, employing over 300 people. The roundhouse still functions in part as a railway workshop, and in part as a museum with many locomotives, carriages and vans from the golden era of rail to walk through and inspect. It was a sad reminder of the decline of passenger rail, and the decline in part of rural towns. Then we went on to the Liquorice and Chocolate Factory for supplies and morning tea. We motored home through heavy rain. All in all, a good weekend. Thanks to John, Pam, Jan, David, Graham, Dulce, Alan, Norm and Penny. Brett Goyne



## Annual Merimbula Jazz Festival June 2016

The jazz festival commenced with a parade of bands, dancers and vintage vehicles down Market Street to the visitors Information centre at 10.30 on Saturday. This was followed for the jazz lovers by the music and dancing at venues all over town & for the car lovers by "Jazz and Jalopies" from 1 to 5pm at the Sapphire Coast Historic Automobile Club on the Pacific highway south of South Pambula just beyond the Yowaka River crossing. There was a vintage car marking the entrance into the car club.

We had lunch at "Oaklands" halfway between Pambula and South Pambula, where they have a nursery and micro brewery and a Leyland double decker bus and an "Oakland" utility which came from Koorawatha, near Young and still runs and a grey "Fergie" amongst other things. Then it pelted rain, so we saved the Jazz and Jalopies for Sunday afternoon.

The car club sits on about 3 acres of land donated or bequeathed by a club member. At the car club there were dozens of spectators' vehicles ancient and modern parked on the lawns. One, parked outside the clubhouse, was a very elegant looking grey Sunbeam Talbot for sale. In the window was a 1953 receipt from Neals Motors in Melbourne for just over 1500 pounds. From memory this would have been a bit more than the price of a Ford V8 in 1953. The Sunbeam Talbot had sporting successes at Le Mans and elsewhere, but I doubt that its owner would have come in to the local general store, with the rear seat cushion removed, as a Ford owner did years ago, to load 3 coils of barbed wire into the back seat and two coils of plain fencing wire into the boot. "Horses for Courses" as they say.



For those who may not have been born in 1953 or have forgotten, this is what a 1953 Sunbeam Talbot looks like. This photo was selected from the internet because I forgot to take my camera.

The clubhouse has a workshop at the front with room for 6 or 7 cars, a hoist and a lathe and work bench. The workshop contained a 5hp Citroen almost identical to the one in the National museum, which was the first car to circumnavigate Australia.

At the clubhouse entrance were two Morris minors, one of which had been converted to an electric vehicle by the students of Eden Marine High School in the club workshop as well as a Falcon Knight engine, sectioned to show the inner workings of the sleeve valve motor.

Inside the clubhouse a jazz band was playing to the audience, who were also being served tea, coffee, biscuits and cake from the kitchen. Behind the clubhouse a sausage sizzle was in progress. Behind that was the "Learmont shed" built by Peter, identical twin brother of the late Don Learmont of CACMC. Outside he had parked an immaculate 1957 Chevrolet almost identical to Don's.

Inside there were about 20 cars, most of which appeared to have been trained not to drip oil on to the floor. They included a bullnose Morris, Model T Fords ranging from brass radiator/ acetylene headlights to the last one, Model A Fords, Chev 4s, a Belgian Minerva, several Packards, an FX Holden and a Lincoln town car complete with boomerang ornament on the boot lid – maybe they expect a visit from Crocodile Dundee.

From the Learmont building we walked up past the club flat, where they can accommodate a couple of visitors, to the club shed containing about 30 club member's cars. Here, there were a Peerless that had been restored in the club workshop, a Chev truck, a Rover 3 litre, Holdens, Fords, MG, Valiant and lots more.

The Sapphire Coast club are a hospitable and welcoming bunch. I am sure they would welcome a visit by CACMC club members. There is plenty of accommodation available nearby in Merimbula, if we wanted to arrange a weekend run.

#### Thanks to Jim Appleby

Jim, Members used to go on a rally down the coast but I think it is five or six years now since the last time. The Bay to Bermagui rally was a first class event organised every odd year by the Classic and Vintage Motor Club of Eurobodalla. That event alternated with a rally in and around Ulladulla every even year. Unfortunately they both seem to have run out of steam.

It must be 20 years since I visited the Sapphire Coast clubhouse and it has certainly got bigger and better. Ed.






