JC 052 - THE STORY

Owner—Peter Castrission (car inherited from Dad in 1987)

The original owner was my father Jack Castrission from Gundagai, NSW. Dad owned and operated the iconic Niagara Café with his brothers. He arrived in Gundagai in 1921 from Greece, aged 14 and worked at the Niagara until he retired and sold the café in 1983.

The car is a ZB Fairlane 500, built in Australia in November 1968 and purchased new by Dad on 15 January 1969 from the local Ford dealer at the time, Gundagai Motors. The car cost \$4029. It was considered a luxury vehicle then, fitted with a 3 speed automatic transmission, front disc brakes and power steering. An aftermarket, under dash air conditioner was fitted in the early 1970s. At the time, Ford were on the cusp of changing their V8 motors from the 289 to the 302. The car has a 302 Windsor, a 4.9 litre power plant. The original colour was 'starlight' blue.

As the car was willed to me, it is a genuine one owner with 78,500 miles on the clock. I was 14 when Dad bought the car and I obtained my driver's licence in the car in 1972, aged 17. When Dad passed away in 1987 the car had 48,000 miles on the clock. I used the car as a daily driver, on and off up until 1997.

I went overseas in 2000 to work and basically the car was in storage in Gundagai from then until mid 2007.

I began a restoration project on the paint and interior in 2009. The car will always be an ongoing project, however, it is basically all original.

Restoration Details

Paint: bare metal respray, Wayne Smith, Fyshwick Panel and Paint ACT, July-September 2009.

Chrome: Bars re chromed by Everlast, Fyshwick, ACT

Interior: Robert Pegg, Macgregor, ACT.

Mechanics: Dyno Tune, Mitchell, ACT.

Exhaust: Belconnen Exhaust Centre, ACT

Wheels: Bob Jane, Belconnen, ACT

Modifications *

- Pacemaker headers and dual stainless steel exhaust
- Holly 500 carburettor and chrome rocker covers/air cleaner
- Additional mirror on left hand side
- Thermostatic fans
- Air horn.
- * All the original parts removed from the car have been retained and restored to original condition. The car could be returned to stock standard condition at any time, relatively quickly.

The number plate JC-052 is a tribute to my Dad Jack Castrission, 52 Punch Street, Gundagai. The old blue girl will always be Dad's car. Enjoy her.

COUNCIL COMMUNIQUE - JULY 2017

GST and the importation of Low Value Goods

The Federal Government's budget proposal to implement GST on goods, including car parts, valued under AU\$ 1000 imported from overseas has been deferred until 1 July 2018.

The delay is to allow the Australian Taxation Office to hold discussions with overseas suppliers on the best way of collecting and remitting the tax. Until now, goods, including car parts, purchased from overseas suppliers such as Moss Brothers, eBay, Amazon and Alibaba etc and valued at under AU\$ 1000 have been GST free.

When this tax change is introduced, the imposition will apply to vehicle parts and goods whether they are second-hand or new.

Tightening of regulations in respect of existing rules banning the import of asbestos

Vehicles imported into Australia are now coming under scrutiny by Australian Border Force who will inspect for traces of asbestos.

The scrutiny has huge implications for members and for the industries that are associated with the importation and maintenance of those vehicles. Importers and customs agents are concerned that vehicles may have to be stripped of parts such as clutch, gaskets, exhaust and brake components that could contain asbestos or any other hazardous or suspicious materials.

The experience of one classic car importer has shown that with costs of \$14000 being incurred, which included a payment to licenced asbestos removalists and hygienists. This is in addition to substantial damage to his 1966 Shelby GT 350 of some \$12000.
