# CACMC excursion to All British Day, Parramatta, 27 August

At the crack of dawn on Sunday 27<sup>th</sup> August, Joe Micallef, Norm and Sue Brennan, Graham Bigg, David Byers, Charlie Adams, Brian Ely, Philip Burroughs and Richard Thwaites set off for the All British Day in the grounds of the King's School, Parramatta. Joe Micallef organised and drove the mini-bus, maintaining maximum legal cruising speed, all wheels in contact with the road most of the time. Joe was keenly supported by several navigators, including at times two separate GPS systems uttering different instructions.

Approaching Parramatta we made visual contact with a shiny MGA emitting smoke signals, and followed it at a respectful distance. More and more British classics converged, and we found ourselves inside the King's School grounds, lined up in the exhibitors' entrance queue. Joe diverted discreetly in the direction of a nearby Chapel that seemed to have empty parking spaces. We put on our best Sunday faces and were ushered to a berth by an energetic Christian lady in hi-vis, who knew that we were not part of her Sunday Chapel congregation, but let us park anyway. A scenic traipse through the King's School extensive hinterlands took us to the rally venue on three well-groomed sports fields.

My favourites were a couple of late-'20s sleeve-valve Daimlers and a massive Bentley of similar vintage, its 6-litre engine garnished with glowing brass and copper pipes and fittings. There was a good range of Vauxhalls but surprisingly few Standards/Vanguards and not many Austins either.

A few of us ran into car people we knew from Canberra and other interstate rallies. I got to attend the Daimler Club concourse awards ceremony and boo the winners, having left my own shabbier example at home.

An AEC London double-decker bus ran a passenger circuit around the school grounds. At home time, Charlie mounted the double-decker and asked to be dropped off at the Chapel, while the rest of us retreated on foot. At the mini-bus, no Charlie. A few phone calls, false clues and circuits of many roundabouts, till the penny dropped that this venue boasts more than one Chapel. More diligent navigation in demanding traffic conditions, then we found Charlie within cooee of a different Chapel on the other side of the school grounds, attended by another hi-vis volunteer who moved witches hats to let our mini-bus make a kerbside pickup.

From the chatter on the way home it's clear we all enjoyed the trip and would recommend it to others in future. Many thanks to Joe for organising, and to Graham Gittins for initiating the event.



#### MY Car - 1969 Cadillac 4 Door Hardtop Sedan

This car was bought in March 2010 from near Camden in NSW.

It had only covered 46,000 miles approx. from new.

Brought into Australia in 1999.

I mainly bought this car as a memento of the '69 Caddy Coupe that I owned in the early 80s. The hardtop that I own now is in far better condition than the coupe that I had years ago!

Incidentally, I found this same coupe about 5 years in a very sorry state (the roof had been amputated) and it was full of rust..... I was told over the phone before inspection that it needed some panelbeating.... he he he . He wanted \$6k for it, and I said forget it!@ . A few years later he was moving house and had to sell it..... so \$1,500 was paid for a parts car, and it has proved to be invaluable as a source of parts for the 69 limo that i am restoring!.

Now back to the hardtop sedan :

This a nice original car that is largely cosmetically original—empire maroon paint / black leather interior / vinyl roof, apart from a paint job that was done some years before I bought the vehicle. I have restored the engine, gearbox, brakes and suspension and added many period Cadillac options which will be listed later on.

It was sold new by Central Cadillac, 360 Central Ave, Newark New Jersey, and was kept in the same family for 30 years - obviously under cover judging by the condition of the interior / exterior!

It is rarely driven, but attracts attention wherever it goes due to its size and style. It is easy to drive, even though it is a large car and has a boulevard ride, a really nice cruiser !

Here are some facts on the '69 Cadillac :

7.8 litre / 472 cubic inch engine producing 375 hp 525 lbft torque on 10.5 compression !

turbo 400 3 speed auto box 3.21 ratio banjo diff vented discs front, finned drums rear 2.3 tonnes unladen ! Gets about 16 mpg hwy / 11 mpg around town - 26 US gallon fuel tank length 18.75 feet

I obtained the following info from GM Archive in the USA, which for \$50 included a very nice inch thick information pack! :

4 door hardtop sedan is style no. 68349 B

This car was built in Detroit 31st January 1969 and was one of 72,958 built of the 4 door hardtop sedans

\$5,954 new, about \$40,000 in todays money..... Electric windows / power steer / auto trans are standard equipment.

My car was fitted with the following optional equipment from the factory :

climate control \$515.75 cruise control \$94.75 door edge guards \$8.45 set dual comfort seat \$105.25 (this is a 40 / 60 6 way electric seat ) drivers 6 way \$89.50 passengers 6 way \$115.80 floor mat set \$16.70 soft ray glass \$52.65 leather \$137.90 radio AM \$162.10 vinyl roof \$152.65

Seven car club members attended the official opening of the RTA's Hume Motor Vehicle Inspection Station on Tuesday 25 July 2017.

The state-of-the-art facility was officially opened by ACT Minister for Regulatory Services Gordon Ramsey and replaces the inspection station at Dickson which will now be used for the light rail project.

Classic cars from Canberra Antique and Classic Motor Club, Triumph Club, MG Car Club, Ford Performance Club, Rolls Royce Owners Club the Holden Club and the Mercedes Benz Club together with one of the new articulated Scania buses in its new blue livery.

A B-double was parked over the pits, the facility allows for the inspection of a B-double coupled-up, which was not possible at the Dickson station, where B doubles had to be uncoupled before driving over the pits.

A crowd puller was an American built nine-ton Police Rescue vehicle. Neil Bates brought along his rally car and a young man gave a demonstration of how he steered a Toyota Camry with his feet because of a hand problem.

Inspection staff took groups through the station showing the various inspection equipment used both at the station and at road side sites.

SES personal provided a delightful sausage sizzle for all participants and the day was judged a success by all who attended.

The Minister signed his name on a wall of art close to the entrance to the building.

The display was organised by Council of ACT Motor Clubs Events Director, Graeme Rossiter, and Council president Mark Saunders attended.

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

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
