NATIONAL MOTORING HERITAGE DAY 20TH MAY 2018 Austin 7 out and about again.

When I got my car on the road a few years ago, the engine was quite smoky.

I had used an engine that someone rebuilt in the 90s as part of an unfinished restoration.

After a long time thinking about putting new rings in the Austin 7 I finally bit the bullet and as a winter project for 2017 I dismantled the engine.

I did a timelapse video of this process which is available at https://youtu.be/RNgN50icuH0?list=PL9iLQDKLI98WfnYICiYMffaHNS7eyacMM

I managed to source a new set of rings from a fellow called Trevor Macgregor- Pacific engine parts in Melbourne.

He has a lot of new old stock rings and can create a set based on your needs.

I got my other parts - new Conrod bearings and gaskets from the Vic Austin 7 Club.

I honed the engine block with help and advice from members of the Fiat Club and cleaned up all the parts. I put the engine back together in November and took it for a few short drives only to find the generator was not charging.

Turns out the armature is kaput. Harry Crawford gave me a few old ones to get tested at the auto electrician but they were no good either.

On Harry's advice to just put it back together and enjoy day time drives, I reassembled the generator on our dining table and got the car going for motoring heritage day.

I took my daughters Sophie and Juliet with me . They were wrapped in blankets to stay warm. We arrived a bit late, got a takeaway hot chocolate and joined the convoy. I realised I hadn't topped up fuel before the drive so we stopped in Watson, lost the convoy and then started the catch up.

We skipped Gungahlin and took the Barton Hwy to Kuringa Drive.

I was quite worried about Coppins crossing and the steep hill coming up from the river, but with a chorus of "you can do it" from all on board we made it.

We were back on track, and after skipping the Athlon drive section we filed in in front of Carl at the Isabella drive round about.

The rest of the drive went well and we made it back to the War Memorial, had a chat then headed home.

Altogether we travelled 80 miles and the engine is no longer smoking and also has what can be described as more 'power'.

I created a short video of the drive.



Richard reported there were 17 members' CRS vehicles on the run and 5 from other clubs.




