A CAR THAT I ONCE OWNED 1932 CHRYSLER IMPERIAL BRIAN McKAY

As this year is the 50th anniversary of our car club, I have been thinking of late about the photos and write-ups our members have submitted to the Colonial over our club history. Surely as a result we must have at least 500 to 600 personal car stories embedded in our system. I recall several such articles submitted myself over this period based on various cars I have owned. But there was one of my former vehicles, which for various reasons never got into print – this was the 1932 Chrysler Imperial (CH Model) which because of its rather "special" nature deserves a mention. Following is a briefing of its history, before I'm too old to recall this (I'm 90 next year!).

The Chrysler story dates back to 1976 when mid-year, my wife and I made a visit to Sydney. In those days, the Sydney weekend papers carried many ads for older cars for sale which I often reviewed. On this particular occasion, I was intrigued by a listing of several such vehicles for sale in Baulkham Hills, near Parramatta.

Accordingly, on our way home to Canberra, we sidetracked with much interest to view this array – a wonderful show of Lincolns, Cadillacs, La Salles, Packards, a Hupmobile, Bentley and the Imperial. These were owned by an enthusiast/business man who had recently moved with his collction to Sydney from Perth. Shortly after arriving in Sydney, however, he was "diverted in his lifestyle" by an attractive local business opportunity which required space and funds – thus the sale of the sumptuous car collection.

On inspection of this lot, the car I most preferred was a 1934 Packard 12 cylinder (twin six) Coupe – original and running and formerly owned by the Robertson (sweets) family. However, the \$7,000 asking price then was beyond me (what a steal now) and I instead purchased the Imperial. This was a rare (1,400 originally built) complete model which had commenced its Australian life as a wedding vehicle, then was owned by an Adelaide family, followed by the Perth enthusiast. To my knowledge, it probably was the only 1932 Imperial to be marketed in Australia.

Although this was the smallest of the Imperial range (a CH and a larger CG model), it nonetheless was a very substantial size with 135 inch wheelbase, a 6.2 litre 8 cylinder inline engine and a gross weight near 2 1/2 tons. Not surprisingly, I didn't have a tow vehicle with the "grunt" to drag my new acquisition back to Canberra and had to rely on club members Bill Amies and Henry le Grande who had the gear to pull these heavy loads.

Well, I would love to tell my readers that I immediately got started on a restoration when I got the car home. But tragically the death of my wife at this time left me with two young children to raise while still employed by the Public Service (BMR). I was only ever able to conduct some minor refurbishing work (including touch-up painting) on the car. However I did manage to trailer it to several local events where it generated a lot of public interest.

Sadly, because of these various reasons (plus a chronic home car storage issue) I finally agreed to sell the Imperial to our Club's Registration Officer Bob Alexander early this century. I am sure Bob, with his automotive skills and interests will have the Chrysler back on the road in the near future, this making a further very interesting addition to our Club's Register.

MESSAGE FROM COUNCIL OF ACT MOTOR CLUB REGISTRAR

Selling or Disposing of a vehicle on CRS or NSW Historic Registration.

If you have a vehicle registered on either the ACT or NSW concessional systems and you sell or dispose of it in any way, **PLEASE** advise Bob Alexander, the CACMC Registrar. The club is required to keep a register of all vehicles currently on concessional plates and also inform the Council of any changes.

AUSTRALIAN MUSCLE CAR MASTERS

The above annual event was held on the June long weekend at the Sydney Motor Sport Park in Eastern Creek brought forward from the usual Fathers Day weekend. The reason for this is speculative although opinion has that it resulted from the inclusion of the HK Holden Monaro's 50th year birthday celebration.

I am a little familiar with this historic challenge, however, I was not aware of the changes until a face book friend of Vanda alerted her. I contacted the organiser who provided me with the information and accepted my application. All he needed was a photo of the car.

On Friday June 8 Vanda and I left for the 2.5 hour drive - me in the yellow Monaro and her in her daily car - stopping at McDonalds in Sutton Forest for a break. On arrival at the SMSP the Monaro was securely garaged in the fire fighters lock up as I had earlier indicated I felt uncomfortable leaving it in the open car park outside the motel overnight.

After having had to move another Holden out of the way (whose owner had obviously shared my anxiety) we collected the car from the shed on Saturday morning and parked it in the HK Monaro Display behind the pits shortly before the beginning of a steady heavy drizzle. The display consisted of two red ones and another yellow which were shortlisted by the organiser, Todd Martin, as they are both 1968 colours. A silver Monaro which grandpa had bought new and driven by the grandson also managed to somehow mingle in the pack. Silver Mink and two other metallic colours are 1969 releases one which was carried over from the HR - Helen, the club's editor, knows which one it is.

While touring the pits we met up with a regular AMCM Canberra team who had recently purchased Dick Johnson's Jim Beam V8 Supercar Falcon. The owner of the team was a regular visitor to the Mitchell Transfer Station where I worked for several years and consequently we became well acquainted. In all the years I have been following the V8's this was the closest I could get to see a V8 Supercar in detail. Most of these racing cars are hand-me-downs Supercars but the preparation and performance is seemingly no different. Safety and strength on these "NASCARS" is built into the roll cage and not in the body work. Among the racing categories were Series Production, Group C and Group A in an assortment of makes. Examples of these were mostly Falcons and Commodores (what else) from the 1960's through to the 1980's and the odd four cylinder imports including Alpha Romeos. Strangely there was only one Monaro.

After lunch all displayed cars were herded on to the soaking track for their parade laps comprising a big selection of all sorts and the five Monaros. Lloyd, the owner of the other yellow one (who also took anti-theft

precautions by double-chaining the car to a post outside his motel room) and I became isolated from the rest of the group and as no mention had been made on speed restrictions we found it difficult to restrain ourselves when we were alongside each other approaching the fast Pit Straight. The crowd loved it.

After lunch Todd led Vanda and I to the Australian Racing Drivers Club Administration Building where the walls of one room had been adorned with black full-length drapes surrounded by flood lights. This is where Holden's 1968 promotional photo shoot of a woman in a white cat suit getting into a Warwick Yellow HK GTS 327 Monaro will be recreated the following day. Two thirty minute sessions had been locked in by the ARDC through a modelling agency to provide a similar bodied female model one at 11.30 for the shoot and the other at 1.30 for anyone to snap their own. He then unrolled two large banners emblazoned with the well-known photograph taken inside Holden's studio at the Lang Lang Proving Ground near Melbourne which he would hang from the wall while at the same time telling me to drive the Monaro into the room so it could be placed into position (where we left it overnight). Vanda and I were in disbelief firstly because we knew nothing of this and secondly Todd had chosen our Monaro. When asked why his reply was because he knows the car.

The following day the weather was still cold and miserable and although all areas were cluttered with people and cars, spectator numbers were lower than previous years. This was attributable to the timing and weather conditions. Next year the event is reverting back to September.

Shortly before 11.00 we made our way to the admin. building after having watched some racing and browsing through the Sunday arrivals which by now covered the entire display, merchandising and pit areas. While waiting we were given the news by the ARDC that the model did not show up nor is she or the agency answering their phones. To say the least this was annoying and disappointing. A quick search for a suitable female dressed in white had been made but in the end we realised it's a failure. I am hoping that both she and the agency will be given a hefty fine should they be unable to justify their failure. Foolishly the ARDC paid the agency and provided the suit up front. The good news is that the set-up attracted professional photographers, journalists and numerous spectators. And we got to keep one banner.

During our waiting all display cars including one of the three Holden Dealer Team HK Monaros which contested the 1968 Bathurst race and finished 3rd (I think) were being assembled on the dummy grid. 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
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
