



EDITOR'S PAGE

Report from July Council Meeting

NSW RMS was changing the system with registrations including Historic plates. There will be no windscreen labels issued for Historic vehicles and some use of electronic pink slips.

The AHMF was doing some lobbying with the issues of luxury tax for heritage vehicles and also the asbestos problem for imports.

Council Registrar had been invited to attend a meeting in the office of the ACT Shadow Minister of Tourism (at the latter's request).

The proposals for the new CRS and Modified Systems together with the draft Memorandum of Understanding had been formally submitted to the ACT Government on 22 June.

It is important that members report any change in CRS registration to our club registrar as Bob is required by the RTA to maintain an accurate register of vehicles in the club.

One member advised that for eight years he had identical full rego plates on his motorbike and car in NSW. (eg, TKD-243). The RMS had advised him this was no longer permitted and on expiry one plate would have to be surrendered.

The delegates agreed that the Wheels ladders should be sold and suggested a Dutch auction at the next Council meeting in August.



MY LATEST ACQUISITION - 1925 VAUXHALL 14/40 LM Malcolm Noad

The car is indeed a Vauxhall 14/40 LM made in 1925. It has a 4 cylinder 2.3 litre motor

The earliest history is that it was restored prior to being auctioned at the 1989 Grand Prix in Adelaide. It was then on sold in April 1991 to a gentleman in Adelaide who kept the vehicle until he passed away in 2012. His wife kept the car until it was auctioned in 2017 and subsequently purchased by Rainsford cars in Adelaide. I purchased the car from Rainsfords and trailered back to Canberra.

The car is fitted with its original sporty touring body by James Flood of Melbourne and was sold new by Barlow Motors, Latrobe Street Melbourne.

The 14/40 LM Series was among the last of the cars produced by Vauxhall during their golden years prior to GM involvement in 1926.

Given the car had been sitting for around 5 years unused prior to the sale it would not run for more than around 2 minutes. The problem proved to be a waxy build-up on the fuel line filter within the fuel tank. Once cleaned the car and the vacuum fuel system worked as intended.

It gets along very nicely and would certainly leave my Bullnose Morris's for dead

There are approx 150 model LM Vauxhall still surviving.



Canberra Car Club turns fifty

The Canberra Antique and Classic Motor Club turns fifty in November 2018. The club formed in late 1968 with eight members now has a membership nearing 300 members.

Members come from all walks of life from public servants, military personal, to retired professional people.

Club president, John Senior said "it would be one of most diverse membership of any club in Canberra, it is as diverse as the vehicles they restore and drive."

"We have an active membership of around 50 men and women, and while we would like younger people to become involved in the various activities of the club, we are very pleased with the range of runs and outings arranged by our events committee members.

"Our half century celebrations include a short tour to the South Coast of New South Wales, a tour to the central west of New South Wales - Oberon, Cowra, Forbes and Parkes, a three week tour of Tasmania, a 50th anniversary and presentation dinner, a calendar featuring members vehicles, various pieces of merchandise and a special edition of the club's magazine *The Colonial* as well as our regular monthly runs around the Canberra Region," he said.

The club boasts more than 500 vehicles on its register, ranging in age from 1911 to 1988. The fleet consist of motor bikes, cars, trucks, caravans, trailers, military vehicles and commercial vehicles.

Club members were largely responsible for the restoration of the Canberra Pie Cart with students from the then Copland College. The restoration of the 1939 Chevrolet van was carried out over a three year period with club members mentoring the college students to bring the Canberra icon back to life.

Each year the club makes a substantial donation to a local Canberra charity and provides vehicles for display at retirement homes, school and church fetes it also makes vehicles available for special displays such as at Seniors Week.

The club meets on the second Tuesday of each month at the Deakin Bridge Club, where it stores its extensive library and memorabilia.

New members with an interest in heritage motoring are always welcome.

We are just entering our 50th year as a club operating here in the Canberra Region. I would think that this would provide adequate ideas for the use of some of

these funds. I continue to await your directions.






