Battle of Waterloo Shaw's Winery Murrumbateman 15 June 2019

In June 1815 the British and forces from Holland, Germany and Prussia led by the Duke of Wellington defeated Napoleon's French army at the Battle of Waterloo in Belgium.

Move now 204 years later to Shaw's Winery at Murrumbateman to a reenactment of the battle by the Gold Trail Re-enactment Group. The 80 strong members of the group from all parts of Australia, brought to life army life on the battlefield of 1815, including life in a Napoleonic military camp complete with straw mattresses (Paillasses), Uniforms Military horses and equipment.

The display started with a flag raising ceremony followed by an infantry, artillery and cavalry display, before the e-enactment of the battle, which took place the day before the actual battle of Waterloo.

Spectators were treated to musket and field canon firings, cavalry charges, hand-to-hand combat and precision marching by the varies armies.

After the battle, spectators were able to tour the camp.

Money raised on the day was donated to the Yass Valley Can Assist.

It is likely that next year the re-enactment will be of bushrangers holding up a stage coach.


To complete a weekend of Battles of Waterloo the French car clubs in Canberra staged its own battle on Sunday 16 June.

The annual face-off between the British and French marques takes place on the battleground known as Queanbeyan Park. Titled the Battle of Waterloo the winner is determined by the country with the greatest number of vehicles on the park at 12 noon.

This year the British won with 71 vehicles while the French could only muster 39 vehicles.




Scrivener Dam and Solar Farm Run Saturday 12 October 2019 (amended)

On the road again - Bambino HIS561 Geoff Hall

Some of you may remember the bright yellow Fiat 500 that used to attend some of our events. Although it looked okay there was a lot of filler in the front, and some of the paint was coming off. Well what started as an exercise to replace some damaged front guards turned into a full strip down and repaint. All when I was just about to put my rebuilt engine in.

I had the front guards replaced by a panel beater then went about the rest of the work by myself and with help from Fiat Club members.

As I removed paint I found the body was very rust free but the back RH panel had significant damage under the paint and filler.

I ordered new parts such as panels, interior seat covers and door cards, cables, etc etc. from a web shop called Axelgerstl in Germany. I found their shipping rates to Australia to be very reasonable.

After a lot of minor body work I painted it. First attempt was not great but with advice from Auto Paint supplies in Fyshwick, and help from Brian Thompson and James Barlow from the Fiat club it turned out quite good. I chose a classic colour close to what I found was original underneath. My Dad did a lot of the cleaning of parts to put back on the car which was greatly appreciated. I had a little help from Pegg's auto trimmers with the bottom of the back seat and did the rest of the interior using the new parts.

In between all this we moved house so after 3 years and 3 months the car was ready to start. First try to drive, with a couple of car shows looming, I found that the pilot bush in the new crankshaft was too tight, so I had direct drive to the gearbox. I have fixed that and the engine is nearly back in, so as I write it is very close to its first proper test drive.

(Not to be put off, I took it to the two Italian Festivals in early June on a trailer.)

Hopefully I'll see you out on a drive in the near future.

I first got to know David Wignall when we moved to Cook and used his BP Service station at Macquarie for refuelling and servicing our two vehicles.

He was always welcoming and friendly and as I got to know him more found out about his interesting racing car career in the 1960s and 70s. He was New South Wales tin top champion three times in 19703-74 and a major attraction at the Tralee speedway track.

Friday after the workshop was closed, he and his two mechanics and myself and occasionally another person would sit on the oil drums, talking and drinking a can of beer, this became a regular ritual every Friday night from around 5.15pm to 6.30pm

David liked, no adored, everything red, his cars were always red, his socks and underpants were red even his coffin was red.

The number 47 also loomed large in his life even to the numberplate on his Holden Ute and his club membership started with the number 47.

I was fortunate enough to catch up with him at Bombala recently as we sat under the shade of a veranda of an outbuilding of the historic homestead Burnima and he reminisced about his life and racing career.

David was a terrific fella, entertaining, irreverent a natural storyteller and a bit of a larrikin.

60 Day registration Scheme

NRMA Insurance update

It was reported recently that NRMA Insurance would not cover historically registered vehicles under the 60 day scheme if the vehicle was used as a daily driver. Advice has now been received from the NRMA Insurance Executive General Manager, overriding the previous advice. Members with NRMA Classic Comprehensive insurance on the 60 day scheme would now be covered for commuting as it was permitted within the registration rules for the scheme.

SELLING OR DISPOSING OF A VEHICLE ON CRS or NSW HISTORIC REGISTRATION

If you have a vehicle registered on either the ACT or NSW concessional systems and you sell or dispose of it in any way, PLEASE advise the Club Registrar, Bob Alexander and Membership Secretary, Joe Vavra. The Club is required to keep a register of all vehicles currently on concessional plates and also inform the Council of ACT Motor Clubs of any changes.

The same applies if you have a vehicle on full registration and change it over to concessional registration.

We chose to do the longest rally which took us to the Hermit's Cave Lookout which proved to be a good spot to get an overall view of Griffith and the surrounding agricultural land. It was then on to Beelbangera and a stop for morning coffee at the local store which proved to be as good as had been recommended. From there to Yenda and a chance to see both the De Bortoli and Casella Family Wineries. The Casella Winery was partly hidden by the stacks of bottles in preparation for bottling. The winery can bottle 36000 bottles an hour.

Our next stop was the Southern Cotton Gin near Whitton. The cotton industry in this region is relatively new, however, last year the Gin processed 147000 tons of cotton. This year the crop is expected to be lower because of water restrictions. The photo shows 6 bales being unloaded at the Gin with part of the stockpile in the background. Each bale weighs 2.5 tonnes and has a value of around \$3000. The seed removed from the cotton is sold to farmers for stockfeed.

After lunch at Darlington Point and a chance to see the truckloads of cotton being delivered to the Gin we returned to Griffith. Saturday night was a dinner at the Exies Club (aka RSL Club).



Following the display the cars paraded through the main street of Griffith on their way to the Pioneer Park Museum for an Italian Lunch and an exploration of the attractions at the Park. A Farewell Dinner and the presentation of awards was held at the Exies Club in the evening.

Monday morning the entrants could breakfast at the Pioneer Park Museum before making their way home.

Overall the Rally organisation was excellent and most enjoyable. The weather was sunny with daily temperatures of 23c and warm nights. One small problem we had was the failure of the alternator on the Austin on the Saturday which was overcome by charging the battery overnight, courtesy of the motel.






