

Council Communique September 2020 Special Edition



60 day usage and club runs for CRS vehicles approved by ACT Government

In a letter to the President of the Council ACT Motor Clubs, Mark Saunders, the Minister for Justice, Consumer Affairs and Road Safety, Shane Rattenbury has advised that he had approved the amendments to the Vintage, Veteran and Historic vehicle scheme to allow for a 60 day and club runs usage.

No start date for the amended scheme has been given to introduce the scheme, as there is some administrative tasks to be worked through such as design of a log book, new number plates and a Memorandum of Understanding between the Government and the Council to be approved.

To qualify for the scheme vehicle owners will have to be a member of a vehicle club in ACT which is affiliated to the Council of ACT Motor Clubs (No change) require to have a road worthy vehicle more than 30 years old and keep a log book entry for each journey undertaken.

The Minister also agreed to allow modified vehicles access to the 60 day arrangement, supported by 'Modified Historic' number plates. Vehicles must be 30 years old, meet full roadworthy requirements and the owner must be a member of a vehicle club affiliated to the Council.

No amendments to registration fees will be needed as part of the new arrangements, apart from the annual review of road transport fees. Premiums for the Motor Accident Insurance will be determined by the relevant Insurance Companies.

This has been a long drawn out process but the ACT is now in line with NSW in this matter. Mr Saunders asked clubs to be patient a little while longer to enable the administrative requirements to be sorted out and put in to place.

World Wide Historic Vehicle Survey

Paris based Federation International Vehicle Ancientes (FIVA), the world historic vehicle governing body is conducting a socio-economic survey to determine the financial and employment contribution that the historic vehicle movement makes to the economies of countries participating in the survey.

All motoring clubs in Australia will be asked to promote the survey among its membership.

The information gained is not identifiable to any specific person, but will help to provide evidence about the importance the industry is when the historic vehicle movement is dealing with governments.

Participants should go to https://fiva.org/en/fiva-survey/ and click the Union jack flag for the English language survey, then complete your address in Australia before completing the survey, which will allow all Australian information to be consolidated.




COTTER PICNIC PARTY This photo is from the Middenhall Collection and is of a group going to picnic at the Cotter in a Chevrolet. My examination of

1971 HG Holden Belmont Utility Andrew McLintock

Before I tell the story of about the car, I wanted to pass on my thanks and appreciation to Alec McKernan. Every year Alec inspected the ute, shared his experiences and made me feel welcome. This year it was Joe who inspected the old girl and did a great job (thank you Joe). It felt a little strange not driving up the side of Alec's house and hearing about what he'd been up to. I really can't thank you enough Alec.

I never thought I'd write a story about the 'old blue ute', she is best described as a diamond in the rough. Probably more rough than diamond. The paint is faded, the interior is worn, the body has rust and she is mechanically tired. Not something that I ever thought anybody would be interested in hearing about.

On the plus side, I believe she is a Canberra car, a factory V8 and apart from the radio and the period floor shift conversion, mostly original as the day she rolled out of the Pagewood factory back in 1971. When I first got her, she had HQ hubcaps but a trip to the next Goulburn swap rectified that. She is Marina Blue, black vinyl interior (perfect for summer) Belmont (base model). The steering is heavy, you can't shift down into second until it's warmed up, it's noisy but she has never let me down (touch wood).

Back in the 90's I decided that a ute would be useful. I looked for ages, but it was slim pickings. To make matters worse, there was an old Holden ute parked in front of a house that I used to drive past most days. A constant reminder of the ute I didn't have. It took a lot of Saturday mornings reading the Canberra Times classifieds, but eventually I found my ute. A very honest white HG, it had been a country car, had red interior and a V8. It was very original, and I loved it. The day before I was due to collect it the owner called and explained he'd taken the car for one last drive and the gearbox had failed. He agreed to fix the car, but I had to wait another 2 weeks before I could collect it. This just made me want the car even more.


Fast forward a few years, money was an issue and sadly the ute had to go. I still remember that sinking feeling as it drove away for the last time. Looking back, it probably worked out for the best but part of me must not have gotten over it. Years down the track, I found myself keeping an eye out for another ute. It didn't take that long before I found myself looking at an old blue HG for sale, it looked passed its best and my brain was telling me to walk away, but there was something familiar about it. After talking to the owner, it turned out it was the same old ute I'd see all those years ago! The head still said no, but the heart won out.

I actually needed a car I could use for a daily drive, a then 30 year old ute wasn't the ideal solution. This became very apparent when I came to get it inspected for a roadworthy, she was fine, except for a very rusty floor! In the end the solution to that problem became a one owner, shadow tone VH SL/E commodore. I needed to stop buying old cars, but it had 12 years on the ute and I could get it registered.

I removed the rust from the floor and got the ute registered but didn't really need it anymore. But there was that sinking feeling from selling the first one. Some 16 years on, I still don't really need the ute, but I still have her. Having a ute has been handy over the years, but a trailer would make more sense.

To restore it properly would be a big undertaking, plus I already have another car in pieces. A few years ago, I took the ute out to Wheels for a run and parked it out of the way so not to lower the tone of the event, but I had a few positive comments about the old girl. The next year I took her back and parked front and centre. I have the added complexity that my 8 year old son, is now a big fan of the 'blue ute'. I don't want him to have that same sinking feeling I had.

I always tried not to buy cars for practical reasons, I probably shouldn't have sold them for the same reasons. I have never seen the original white ute again either, if I ever did find her and had the opportunity to get it back, would I have 2 utes I don't need? In a heartbeat.




