# DRAFT MINUTES OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 9TH November 2021

A quorum of 30 members was present.

President Graham Waite official opened the Annual General Meeting.

### Treasurer's Report: Gerry Walker

The 2020/21 financial year has seen little change in the Club's financial position. The main financial arrangements will need to change for 2021/22 as more businesses are not accepting cheques (banks charging \$5 per cheque to the business) and more businesses seeking electronic transfers. Our present bank does not allow Associations to use an electronic system with dual authorisations as required by our Constitution. Other banks do, some with minor processing costs (20 cents at present.)

At present all funds are held in the cheque account and electronic funds transfer from members' own facilities have been used to pay on invoices with the members being subsequently reimbursed. This obviously cannot go on so new banking facilities will need to be arranged.

The main expense agreed for the coming year by the Management Committee is the refurbishment of the car trailer. A motion was also presented by members to a general meeting to purchase a container for storage of Club assets (including the barbeque trailer). The motion was passed and a container purchased recently. The storage of and access to the container is presently being arranged. I assume members who so avidly supported the purchase will assist in its management.

## Terribly British Day 2021- a great success

For 46 years, since 1975, the best of British vehicles has been displayed in Canberra.

The 2021 display was held on the Queanbeyan Park on Sunday 5 December and attracted 220 vehicles and 30 motor bikes. All the famous marques were there including Austin, Morris, Jaguar, Armstrong Sidley, Triumph, MG, Rolls Royce, Bentley, Aston Martin, Vanguard and Morgan.

The E-type Jaguar was a main feature of the display as it was celebrating its 60 anniversary. Declan O'Keeffe's 4.2 litre, brilliant signal red E-Type featured in the *Canberra Times* on Sunday 5 December, was one of twenty-two E-Types on display.

Making its first public appearance was Graham Gittins newly acquired 1953 Triumph Mayflower.

Former Mayor of Queanbeyan and Palerang Regional Council, Tim Overall and his wife, Nicole, a candidate for the NSW state seat of Monaro, by-election in February 2022, were the special guests charged with selecting the cars they would most like to take home. Nicole's choice was Bob and Carolyn Hogan from Batemans Bay, 1929 Austin Seven "Splinter" (Woody Station Wagon.)

Tim selected Cooma Couples, Colin and Cheryl Moul's, 1951 Riley RMB.



### **Luxury Car Tax warning**

The Australian Taxation Office (ATO) has issued a warning to people importing new or second hand vehicles, not to fall for illegal schemes to avoid paying the Luxury Car Tax.

The ATO has accelerated their efforts to create a level playing field for the Australian community, holding those that do the wrong thing accountable, with the release of Taxpayer Alert TA 2021/4. This alert outlines the ATO's concerns with some arrangements involving the sale of new and some second-hand luxury cars.

The ATO now reviews every LCT refund claim and will stop invoices that appear to be higher risk.

Vehicle owners using arrangements which are illegal may result in penalties and sanctions.

Owners who are concerned that they may have purchased a car as part of an arrangement can make a voluntary disclosure or an anonymous tip-off by calling the ATO hotline on 1800 060 062.

The Council has been advised that the 60 day usage scheme has been agreed by the ACT Government Registration Review Panel and Finance Committee, but the implementation will not take place for nine to 12 months.

### **DUNTROON DAIRY**



Duntroon Dairy is a remarkable survivor of farming days. Many families lived and worked in simple stone or timber buildings near the Molonglo River, but Canberra's construction destroyed most of them. The dairy is the oldest building on Duntroon Estate and Canberra's oldest European building. Around 1832, soon after Robert Campbell settled Duntroon, the dairy was built above the fertile floodplain to provide milk and butter for the many people living on his estate. The building 5 m wide by 15 m, long is made of local stone and is set into the lower slopes overlooking the flood plain of the Molonglo River. A well is dug into a natural spring to provide water and cooling for the interior of the building.

The property became home to several generations of many families who worked for Campbell. For example, Ambrose Austen, who became dairyman in 1865, extended the stone dairy in brick and built a family cottage. His daughters, Alice Warwick and Elizabeth Mayo, continued living at Duntroon Dairy. Even after Duntroon was resumed in 1911, Elizabeth's daughter Jennet and son-in-law Charles Edlington leased back the land and continued dairying into the 1960s.

Most buildings were then demolished. Their ruins form a well-marked archaeological site. The shingle-roofed dairy has been carefully restored, and you can walk around the cool interior (on Open Day) or read fascinating sign-boards outside telling this story of farm life on the Limestone Plains.

### HISTORIC VEHICLE 1808 1977/8 TRIUMPH TR YSM869

This car began life as a TR7 coupe in late 1977 in the SPEKE factory in England. It is probably one of the incomplete vehicles locked in the factory during the *strike* lasted from October 1977 to March 1978. The Australian Compliance Plate was fitted in Sydney in May 1978.

Starting in late 1987 the car was modified to mechanically resemble the factory TR7/V8 rally cars of 1977 to1981 approx. The instructions to the workshop ordered a very plain exterior with minimal chrome no badges, stickers or other ornaments which was the fashion for custom cars at that time. The car was registered in the ACT as a TR8 when completed.

I purchased the car in September 2011 in pieces from a deceased estate. It had been unregistered for at least 5 years and stored under a tree. The engine was on the floor and partially disassembled and the gearbox was under the bench wrapped in plastic sheet (more about that later). The exhaust system consisted solely of a pair of very rusty headers which had been xy cut from the rest of the pipes. I have refurbished the car to reflect that period finally getting Rego in time for *The Terribly British Day* December 2020.

### Repairs include

remove the wiring harness to clean corrosion from all connections

clean and repaint the chassis and floor pan

clean and repaint all suspension parts and the rear axle

replace all suspension bushes and ball joints

replace brake master cylinder, hoses and brake pads

rebuild the engine (with lower compression)

replace the carby with a new one with an operational choke

replace clutch

replace the exhaust system with a four box twin pipe free flow set up all in

remove huge stereo. 2 amplifiers and the useless alarm system

repair panel damage (nothing serious)

radiator overhauled

body repainted in my shed

clean and repair door locks and window regulators replace battery and tyres

The interior trim is as installed in 1988 but cleaned several times, the cloth and carpet is said to be as used in the Holden Calais of that time.

This process took the best part of 10 years as there were a few distractions such as weddings, the arrival of 5 more grandchildren, several encounters with cancer, moving house to name a few.

Since registration I have replaced the water pump (leaking seal), overhauled the brake booster, replaced the clutch master cylinder and hydraulic hose, overhauled the clutch slave cylinder

When I purchased the car I was told the gearbox had been overhauled by an expert. Before it was installed the gearbox seemed to select all gears if somewhat reluctantly. From the first drive the change was stiff and notchy and the first time I tried for 5th gear (on the way home from the roadworthy inspection) it rrefused to select and briefly locked in neutral. After much head scratching, checking the shift mechanism that was visible and reading the workshop manual many times I concluded that the problem was in the 5th gear selectors in the gearbox extension housing. The gearbox must come out which entailed removing the entire exhaust from the rear bumper to the cylinder heads. As the internals of the gearbox area all assembled through the rear of the casing and I do not have the jigs or tools to check the end-float I took the gearbox to Auto Torque in Phillip. Their initial diagnosis was incorrect assembly of the 5th gear selector leading to mechanical damage to the lockout mechanism. Complete inspection of the gearbox internals revealed that the expert (X being an unknown quantity and spurt being a drip under pressure) had replaced the bearing cones but NOT the cups. New parts were located in Sydney which lead to 2 satchels being sent EXPRESS POST. Only takes 6 or 7 business days each delivery. The gearbox now changes very smoothly and with a much lower effort than before. Thank you Auto Torque.

### New way of deciding Car of the Show at Shannons Wheels

Visitors to the Shannons Wheels vehicle display on the Queanbeyan Show-ground on 6 March are alerted to take plenty of gold coins with them.

During the 2022 event, the 'Car of the Show' trophy will be decided in a trial method, by the amount of donated coins each participant receives from the public. Each participant will have a box located near their vehicle and a sign indicating that the money raised will be donated to the Stroke Foundation and will go towards their vehicle being awarded the 'Car of the Show' trophy.

More than 750 vehicles are expected to be on display on Sunday 6 March 2022, entry is by gold coin donation, which will be donated to the Technology for Ageing and Disability (TADACT).

2022 marks the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the popular display which brings together veteran, vintage and classic vehicles from Canberra and regional vehicle clubs.

This year there will be spotlight displays to mark special anniversaries: Austin 7 100 years and Jeep 80 years. There will also be spotlight display of bubble cars including, Isetta, Messerschmitt, a German Amphicar and the Australian Federal Police (AFP) will be represented by vehicles from the Police historic fleet.

The Historic Fire Brigade will be represented by heritage fire appliances and the Electric Vehicle Association will have 12 vehicles on display.

The Shannons Wheels display is the Council of ACT Motor Clubs annual charity day and is organised on behalf of the Council by the Canberra Antique and Classic Motor Club (CACMC) and supported by the Queanbeyan and Palerang Regional Council and local businesses. Shannons Insurance have been long time sponsors of the event.

The display is open to the public from 10.00am to 1.30pm
