#### Mundi Mundi Bash

Ken and Judy Herne and Michael and Anne Toole departed Canberra on Easter Saturday 2022 heading towards Silverton for the inaugural 2021 Mundi Mundi bash that was delayed for 12 months because of Covid.

The Broken Hill Mundi Mundi Bash, Australia's newest outback music festival was set on the stunning red dirt of the Mundi Mundi Plains with the beautiful Barrier Ranges as a backdrop.

It had a stellar line up of Australian rock legends headlined by Paul Kelly, John Williamson, Russell Morris, Glen Shorrock, Kate Cebrano, Dragon and many others and was located close to the historic Broken Hill region which has so much to offer those looking for history, outback adventure, natural beauty, arts and more.

Forbes was our first stop, then Cobar and then into Broken Hill for two nights camping at the race course, and it rained, where we teamed up with John Tibben a friend of Ken's.

Wednesday morning we departed early and arrived at the Mundi Mundi plains and were allocated a camping spot. We were lucky as we only had to wait in the queue for 30 minutes, but we found out that with the rain delays there was a 5 hours wait in the queue for campsite allocation on Tuesday. There were 9000 people at the concert and they arrived over 3 days.

We set up camp and had a leisurely day settling in as the concert started on Thursday. From Thursday to Saturday we were entertained by Australian music royalty from 2 pm to 8 pm each day.

Sunday was a day of rest. We decided not to join the 8,000 people in 4,000 caravans trying to depart early to beat the rush. We had decided to camp an extra day to make the dawn service on Monday morning, after which we departed Mundi Mundi. Anne and I heading to Queensland to visit relatives and Ken and Judy heading to South Australia, and then to continue on their journey around Australia that was cancelled in 2020 because of Covid.

At the camp site you had to be self-contained as there was no water, no electricity, and no alcohol for sale so you had to bring your own. Luckily both Ken's and our van are solar powered and both are able to carry enough water (and alcohol) to provide us with a comfortable campsite. And yes, I was able to shower (very quickly) each day. I now know that 140 litres of water will sustain Anne and I over 6 days (5 nights) in cleanliness as well as providing washing up water and drinking water.

In summary, a three day concert rocking the plains west of broken hill with top quality artists.

Was it worth the hassle of driving all that distance, camping in the bush and then driving home again? - Certainly.






