Meeting with ACT Govt to discuss event space(s) in ACT - postponed due to lack of ACT staff!

WHEELS 2023 is to be held at Queanbeyan Showgrounds on Sunday 19th February Please ensure that all CACTMC affiliated clubs are aware of the date.

- · Wheels 2023 to be -hosted by Canberra Antique & Classic Motor Club.
- Battle of Waterloo on Sunday 19th June: to be hosted jointly by French Car Club, Mini Car Club and Triumph Car Club.
- \cdot Meeting with ACT Govt to discuss event space(s) in ACT postponed due to lack of ACT staff!
- Marques in the Park (MITP): The American Car Club (ACC) have expressed interest in taking over MITP. CACTMC have had no effective oversight of the management of the event for several years. This situation creates potential financial & reputational risks for CACTMC. Therefore, the Committee is proposing that the event be transferred to ACC for them to run the event as an ACC event without CACTMC endorsement or financial support from CACTMC. This action should also result in reducing CACTMC's significant Public Liability Insurance costs.
- · Perceived issues with the inclusion of personal plates under the changed CRS discussed. Motion to communicate these potential issues with ACT Govt defeated.
- · Changes to ACT CRS: Awaiting upgrade to Access Canberra's computerised administration system. Therefore CRS changes not likely to be implemented prior to September.

Motor Manuals: CACTMC STILL has a number of workshop/motor manuals that are free to clubs for club members' use. 

Vale Ken Walker

Dr Kenneth Ridley Walker 12 January 1928-7 June 2022

Ken and Jeanette Walker joined our Club in 1988.

Their involvement in Club events with their little red Austin 7 Chummy has been most memorable. In recent times the Chummy was sold and replaced with a blue Austin 7 Pramhood. Ken also drove a white Austin A40 Jensen Sports and a green Austin Healey Sprite.

The Austin 7 was featured on the cover of the September 1992 "Colonial".

This is the story Ken wrote about his Austin 7 in that issue.

"My Chummy - or that B*!#*! little vintage car It all started about 45 years ago, just after the Second World War, when I was a student at University and had bought a 1928 Austin 7 in pieces. This was my introduction to car ownership and from the start I learnt the hard way. I was soon to find it was in bits because it had been cannibalised for parts during the war - so it became the first of a series I owned then, from Chummies to Specials. These tended to make me, in an untrained way, self-reliant in car construction and maintenance.

I separated from these cars when I moved to Canberra in the early fifties. A period of 30 years lapsed before nostalgia got the better of me. I responded to an advertisement in the Canberra Times for a collection of Austin 7 parts, attracted by the fact that the parts were claimed to be from an early beaded edge wheel model, the Pramhood Austin 7, of 1924 vintage. But again the collection was very incomplete, and this time an almost unrecognisable heap of rusted metal!

But by now of course, I knew the Austin 7 historically had spawned great things in the motor car industry, so I took courage to meet this new challenge to create another Baby!

Indeed, Sir Herbert Austin's evergreen Seven can reasonably claim to be the forerunner to BMW in Germany, Datsun in Japan and in Britain indirectly to the Jaguar through the Swallow (Swallow Sidecar and Coach Building Co.) It also sold under license in France as the Rosengarf and in the USA as the Bantam. It dominated the small car field from 1922 to 1939, found its wav to most countries, if only in some cases to traverse them with intrepid travellers venturing on around-the-world trips.

It also showed its prowess in motor sport where the eye-catching (and Champion) Austin 7 Sports cars and Specials fascinated motoring enthusiasts with their appearance and performance. In all, about 375,000 in its various forms were produced.

But back again to my current venture in Austineering. I found the task of progressively collecting and restoring bits and pieces was taking a long time, and on joining CACMC a few years ago some form of 'wheels' would be an advantage in being an active member. So when a complete but tired Austin 7 came on offer - it had been resting for ten years - I decided to negotiate to buy, and so far the joys of vintage motoring have kept my flagging interest going in restoration, because the gestation period of the early Pramhood Baby was much longer than I expected, and parts were becoming harder to find and more expensive to restore as time passed.

So, number one job over the last 18 months has been to make my 1929 Austin 7 Chummy authentic to its vintage and reliable to enjoy in all situations, to the point I have full confidence in the car. Mechanically it was a bit of a disaster though potentially much was there to make it a good car. So with renewed enthusiasm I spent many an hour, week etc methodically going over it from one end to another, replacing faulty and non-authentic components, rebuilding many parts mechanical and electrical and generally tidying up the body. It is now mechanically and to the body type, true to the 1929 Chummy model with a Holden body, exactly as pictured in the Macquarie Dictionary of Motoring.

It has now become immune to the quips and jokes lovingly bestowed on Austin 7's like that recently experienced on the South Coast trip to Narooma for the Christmas in July run when I understand a Bega Milk Tanker's patience was tried on a steep incline to Central Tilba, and found wanting. Tony James tells me he passed the tanker that was following me, in his EH Holden and then, when he was rounding a corner further ahead of us, came upon a horse and cart. Feeling obliged to warn the tanker driver of the road hazard he called him on his CB, 'Thought I'd better warn you there's a horse and cart on the road - just in case you come upon it suddenly rounding a corner'.

Replied the tanker driver, "Don't worry mate, I'm behind it now – a B*!#*! Little vintage car!".

But for me without a CB, a surprise - there was indeed a horse and cart a little further along the road as Tony had warned. No worries for the Chummy though - its brakes coped."

Ken was always interested in members' vehicles and was friendly to us all. He attended many Austins Over Australia national rallies and was a regular attendee at the Winton Historic Races at Benalla

He will be fondly remembered by all of us who knew him.

Thanks to Roger Amos for this tribute.

In his working life, Ken was a geologist with the Department of Mineral Resources.



Classic Cars Are Greener Than Electric Vehicles: Study

Classic Cars Are Greener Than Electric Vehicles: Study (msn.com)

I can't even tell you how many times I've heard people yammer on and on about how horrible classic cars are for the environment. Usually their eyes are bugging out, spittle's flying out of their mouth, and they're absolutely filled with self-righteousness but few facts. They'll vehemently insist that driving your old Camaro, Mustang, Charger, or whatever you own is absolutely destroying the planet in real time while refusing to discuss the process of extracting minerals for making EV batteries, let alone the insane energy levels required in the manufacturing process. That's why reading a new study from UK insurance provider Footman James is so refreshing because it doesn't talk emotional rage, sticking instead to the inconvenient facts.

Even inside this industry there are those running around claiming all classic cars will be electrified in 10 or 15 years or whatever time frame they were told by someone else. The assumption is this will be good for the environment, that driving a classic car with batteries and an electric motor will cause trees to spring forth in the Sahara Desert and the unicorns to return from the ocean.

According to Footman James' study, reality is far different because classic cars with those evil, gas-burning engines are better for the environment than new electric vehicles. The thing is people who believe the opposite just look at tailpipe emissions, behaving as if that's everything in the equation. They don't consider pollution generated by the manufacturing process.

In the study, Footman James mentions that in the UK a classic car on average is driven 1,200 miles a year and puts out 563 kg of CO2 as a result. But a new VW Golf is made by generating 6.8 tonnes of CO2e. Even worse, a Polestar 2 (a Swedish electric car) generates 26 tonnes of CO2 during the manufacturing process. That means you could drive your classic car for over 46 years before it generates as much CO2 as the "green" electric vehicle. Let that sink in for a moment.

Footman James rightly points out that within that 46-year period, the Polestar 2's battery will need to be replaced, maybe even swapped for a new one twice or more. And what happens to the battery? Can it really be recycled? The answer for now is no. Meanwhile, the classic car keeps running without contributing significantly to a landfill. But you should feel bad for driving such an awful pollution machine, or so we're told.

I wish the study dug more into the human and environmental costs associated with the extraction of raw materials to build electric cars. There's also the fact many of these minerals are mined in authoritarian countries like China and Russia where many accusations have been levied that slave labour is used in the process.

Keep all this in mind the next time your neighbour, relative, or friend who just bought a shiny new Tesla tries guilt tripping you about owning and driving a classic. Sure, the smug self-righteous attitude can be annoying, especially when people who know next to nothing about cars are just fascinated by anything novel, but the facts don't exactly back up their daydreams of becoming Captain Planet.

Well, how about that...

Check out Footman James' study for yourself.




