Asked where he could locate a brake cable, he was advised that the Canberra Yacht club Ships Chandler may be able to repair or make one up.





Vale Willem De Graaf 20 July 1935—12 June 2022 Life Member of CACMC

A photo of Willi's Mostin appeared on the cover of the September 1998 "Colonial". The accompanying article published on this car has been used in writing this item.

Willi helped many club members searching for parts and by doing odd jobs. Welding and panel work were his special skills. His hobbies included repairing and collecting antique guns and pistols and building models of historic sailing ships. His front garden was filled with his creations one being a realistic historic cannon.

Willi built a special bodied sports car of his own design from the vintage 12hp parts that he had lying behind his garage after restoring a 12hp Austin two seater.

To build a special body on a large Austin chassis using the Austin radiator restricted the opportunity of giving a slim profile.

Willi borrowed a book from a friend showing many of the specials built during the vintage years using radiators from other makes giving him the opportunity for some unusual body designs.

A Bullnose Morris radiator was obtained, then he fitted an Austin radiator core behind it giving the cooling area needed for the larger Austin engine. The Morris radiator gave the narrow profile for the special body.

The car was totally built by Willi in his home workshop doing all the work himself. Design, welding, fitting, mechanical, upholstery, electrical, painting. The body frame was steel, covered with lightweight steel sheet. The car has a standard Austin I2hp running gear and is fitted with wire spoke wheels, which give the car a better appearance than the Sankey spoked wheels usually seen on the Austin.

He also restored a 9hp Singer, a 7hp Austin, a l2hp Austin and assisted with a Brescia Bugatti and Jim Bruce's Old Number One MG.

He also restored two Sunbeams, a 1928 Sunbeam and a 1929 Sunbeam into which he placed a leather lounge as the back seat.

Willi was a likeable character and his contribution to the veteran, vintage and historic vehicle movement has been appreciated by many who will miss him and remember him with great affection.

Over 20 years of memories of our friendship.

Fond memories of my 10am regular coffees with Billie and Mary and travelling with them on the rallies. Often Billie would be searching the antique shops for old guns to restore, old clocks and auto parts. Mary I think took care of me as Kay was not able to be there and I was travelling solo.

Billie often spoke of his childhood during the war and being transported to a village in Germany and the school where they were subjected to the Nazi propaganda. On travelling to Oz he would tell of the early days walking from home in Hall to Kingston for work. At that time it was a time of trapping rabbits and fishing to eke out a living. He also spoke of his time playing the guitar and singing at the Canberra Rex where Bob Hawke often frequented. Billie was also Black Peter at Christmas until political correctness stepped in.

Billie was a talented artisan, his cannons, clock restorations, gun and car restorations/creations were testament to this. He also built some amazing models of early Dutch ships. Mary also collected dolls and had an amazing dolls house.

His Sunbeam sedan was the first car I knew they had, he always told the story of how he negotiated with Mary to use their sofa for the Sunbeam seats . Billie sold the car later as it was a bit heavy to handle.

Billie was innovative seeing in everyday items a base to make a car part. His latest Sunbeam was created out of an Austin Chassis and a Sunbeam motor. Billie fossicked for parts and built bodywork and made numerous parts. The Sunbeam is fortunately now with son Bill.

Billie acquired a 1909 Hupmobile as a chassis, engine, gearbox and and other parts from John Ahearn about 6 or 7 years ago. A challenge but one which with his own skills and the help of other members of the car movement he rebuilt, remade and assembled a "new" 1909 Hupmobile 20. One of the tasks he didn't have to make was the beautiful radiator which John Ahearn made.

Parts for the Hupmobile were sourced from as far afield as Launceston in Tasmania. Billie built the bodywork, the car finally went to a collector in Victoria.

The last car he worked on with his son Bill was a rare AC sports car, those who attended Shannons Wheels 2022 would have seen it. Check out the boat tail that was one of his fabrications.

Billie helped many car club members. I remember seeing him make a De Dion-Bouton from scratch, piping galore and over 600 baffles around the pipes. He was rather a hard taskmaster which I should imagine many of the apprentices found out in their work with him.

Billie helped me on numerous occasions maybe with advise or skills. I had an oil feeder pipe on the Vauxhall head needing some soldering. I spent ages cleaning the head and his first words when he saw it were "I'll just clean it up a bit", that was Billie. He also helped in other ways, my gates at home were made with major help from Billie with his knowledge and welding skills.




