### LAUNCH OF THE 60 DAY USAGE SCHEME—3 APRIL 2023

It has taken nearly five years of negotiation but the 60-day usage for heritage vehicles is finally here.

At a media launch of the 60-day day usage scheme, the Council of ACT Motor Clubs president Roger Amos, provided the Minister for Transport The Hon. Chris Steel with a background to the scheme and its importance to the heritage motor movement in the ACT.

The ACT now joins the other State and Territory jurisdictions who have been operating a similar scheme for some years.

The Minister, congratulated the Council on persevering with the introduction of the log book based scheme, which allows concessionally register vehicles unlimited use of their vehicles for 60-days in any one registration year, except for commercial use.

Council Registrar Dave Rogers explained some of the detail of the scheme to a select group of car club members and the media.

As an added attraction five heritage vehicles and a motor bike were displayed on the square.

After the formalities guests were invited to morning tea in the Civic Square precinct.

### 48th National Vauxhall Rally

I attended the 48th National Vauxhall Rally in March.

I used the Car Club trailer to tow my 1937 DX Vauxhall to Pambula. My brother and his wife drove from Millthorpe in their 1964 Viva and followed me from Canberra to Pambula.

The Rally was organised from "Vauxhall Central" based at the Pambula Holiday Park where we stayed in a beach side cabin for the week.

54 Vauxhalls were gathered with 139 Vauxhall owners and friends.

The Rally was planned to give plenty of time for inter-state members to have a great holiday.

Three one-day Runs were organised.

One south to Eden and the Seahorse Inn at Boydtown returning via an inland route through Nethercote and Lochiel.

The second to the west through Wyndam, Myrtle Mountain, Candelo and Wolumla.

A third to the north through Tarthra, Bermagui, Central Tilba returning via Cobargo and Bega.

It may have been fortunate that my Vauxhall was not performing well as all three runs were beyond the capabilities of the old girl so I travelled in the Viva or used my modern tow vehicle.

We visited the Pambula Car Club facility. They have almost as many members as CACMC with many sheds on a six hectare block just south of Pambula. Members park their cars in one very large shed while a second large shed houses Don Learmont's collection. Some of these cars were once owned by Peter Learmont and belonged to our club. Don constructed the shed to house his collection on the understanding that it would belong to the Pambula Car Club when he passes.

Club rooms are located between the two sheds and is a wonderful facility.

The "Show and Shine" was located next to the Sunday Rotary Markets in Merimbula and owners were encouraged to dress in fashions of the period to match their car. Owners and visitors were encouraged to vote for the vehicle of their choice and I was pleased to note that the DX received more votes than the Viva. The winning car was the 1934 BX Vauxhall that was restored by Simon Brown and once owned by Naomi and Cec Brown.

The Rally was very well organised and everyone had a great time.

I can recommend the Far South Coast on NSW as a holiday destination as the drive and views are spectacular.

### Council Affiliation Fees Due

Council affiliation fees are due not later than 30 June. The Committee encourages Clubs that can, to reaffiliate before 30 May to assist the Council Secretary reconcile and the Registrar to lodge CRS paperwork timely with Roads and Traffic Authority ACT. The documentation necessary to reaffiliate may be found on the Council website.

Those affiliated clubs who have not already done so, should send a copy of their Incorporation Certificate or other proof with the appropriate affiliation documentation. Failure to do so will mean the Club is disaffiliated from the Council and therefore any club members with CRS registered vehicles will be deemed unregistered and should not be driven on public roads.

### 60-day usage scheme

The launch on 3 April 2023 of the 60-day usage scheme for CRS vehicles heralded a new era for the heritage vehicle movement in the ACT.

In the presence of two ACT Government Ministers - Minister for Transport Canberra, The Hon Chris Steel and Minister for ACT Police The Hon Mick Gentleman the launch attracted a wide selection of media - press, TV, radio and social media.

There are several perceived issues to be worked through with Transport Canberra but generally the new system is working well. As Council Registrar, Dave Rogers, commented to Minister Chris Steel 'The 60-day usage scheme took longer than World War 1 but we are now in Treaty of Versailles'.

### Australian Historic Motoring Federation

Council was a member of the Australian Historic Motoring Federation (AHMF) for many years, but following a review of its membership, came to the conclusion that Council was not getting value for its membership fee and decided not to remain a member.

At the April 2023 Council Committee meeting Mrs Christine Hillbrick-Boyd, Secretary of the AHMF made a presentation to the committee members asking that the Council reconsider re-joining the Federation, which has undergone considerable change and is allegedly more relevant to today's heritage motoring needs.

The Council Committee will consider its recommendation and advise delegates of its decision whether it should re-join the Federation.

### Shannons Wheels 2024

The Shannons Wheels 2023 charity vehicle display on the Queanbeyan Show-ground was judged the best ever.

Organised on behalf of the Council by the Canberra Antique and Classic Motor Club for four years, the club has advised the Council that it is time for another Council affiliated club to take it over. The Club has prepared a 'to do' schedule to assist the new organising club.

Council Secretary, Peter Atkinson, has requested that any affiliated club interested in organising the Wheels 2024 to contact him ASAP.

# REDEX Reliability Trial 70th Anniversary re-run this coming August

The 1953 REDEX 'Reliability' Trial captured the imagination of the Australian public; it also demonstrated the capability and reliability of the 'modern' cars of that time.

143 out of 182 cars completed the 10,000 km trial in September 1953; of which 18 were Holdens (recorded as Holden 48 -215s) and 10 were Peugeot 203s. The cars that completed the endurance trial also included Standard Vanguards, Humber Super Snipes, Austin A40s, Ford Customlines, MG TDs, Riley 2.5 Litres, Jaguar Mark VIIs, a Jowett Javelin, Mercedes Benz 170s, a Ford Zephyr Six and Ford Consuls, pre-war Terraplanes, a Vauxhall Velox, a Porsche 356, Rover 75s, and a Renault 750. The winners were Ken Tubman and John Marshall in a Peugeot 203, which was only settled by a tie breaker stage on the last day; while the first 20 finishers included 4 Holdens and 3 Peugeots.

To commemorate what was also known as the inaugural Round Australia Trial, the Peugeot Car Club of Victoria (PCCV) is planning to conduct a 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary REDEX RERUN, basically a 3-day tour from Melbourne to Sydney – at this time scheduled to be from the 3-5 August. As much of the route as possible will be along the old Hume Highway alignment; except that it will include visiting Canberra on the second day and include the Marulan tie breaker stage on the final day.

In the first place, the re-run event will be open to car models that were onsale during the first half of the 1950s with a maximum entry of 60 cars. Also, initially 15 places will be reserved each for FX/FJ model Holdens and Peugeot 203s.




