FRANCIS BIRTLES' LONDON TO AUSTRALIA TRIP IN 1927

Most of you club members would have seen on ABC_TV and perhaps read the book of the story of the recent Peking to Paris car run comprising five Veteran cars.

On completion of that run Warren Brown was asked "What is your next project, now that the Peking to Paris run is completed?" He stated that he would like to drive a Bean like Birtles' car from London to Australia as Birtles had done in 1927.

Birtles was asked by the Bean Car Company of Wolverhampton UK to drive a Bean model 14 to Australia as an advertising promotion for the company. Birtles agreed, so long as he could design his own car. This he did with a boat tailed two seater sports type body on a conventional Bean 14 chassis.



A mutual friend of mine and of Warren suggested to Warren there is a bloke called McKernan in Canberra who owns two Bean cars, one a four door tourer and the other a replica of Birtles car which is a 1925 model, as was Birtles car.

In due course Warren came to visit me and over afternoon tea I learned about his proposed trip from London to Melbourne.

I drove him around for awhile to familiarise him with the car. He declined to drive at that stage. He sheepishly asked if the car was for sale. I stated I was not proposing to put it on the open market, but given the increasing problems being encountered with arthritis in thumbs, wrists and knees limiting my ability to enjoy driving such older cars that I would be interested in selling him the car. In addition, I was very interested in the Birtles run of 1927, and the fact that Warren needed such a car to do such a trip.

My friend Des Rees, who helped prepare the Birtles car for the National Museum had gathered up a fair amount of Bean spares and started to build a replica of Birtles car for himself. The TAFE assisted by building as a class project the boat tail part of the body. From about then Des' health sapped his enthusiasm and the project ceased.

Des contacted me to offer me the project as far as it had progressed, along with all the spares. So, in due course I bought it all and continued building the replica where Des had left off. Using my engineering background I incorporated a number of engine and other improvements such as a change in diff ratio from the normal 4.7 to 1 to 3.9 to 1, improved cam profiles, dynamic balancing of the crankshaft with flywheel attached, an SU carburettor, hardened valve seats for unleaded fuel, and slightly increased compression ratio etc.

Warren and his team and those of the ABC plan to depart London in October 2007 on their trip to Australia keeping as close to Birtles route as much as possible though Folkstone, Calais, Strasbourg, Milan, across Yugoslavia, Greece, ship from Piraeus to Alexandria, Cairo into Palestine, Iraq, Syria, Iran, Delhi, India, Burma into Malaysia, and south to Singapore, a ship to Darwin and then across Australia to Melbourne.

On the way to Melbourne the trip is expected to go through Sydney and Canberra. We are proposing to meet the team in Darwin to convoy with them (in a modern car) to Melbourne.

Warren is proposing to leave London on the 19th October 2007 which is exactly 80 years since Birtles left there.

As part of the purchase deal I gave him one of three spare unrestored engines I have, also an unrestored radiator. I am lending him four original Bean wheels in case they are needed. I have restored all the vital parts of the car so I do not expect any problems with these. The 15,000 mile trip will probably wear out at least one set of tyres.

The ABC propose televising the run and it is expected to go to air in much the same format as did the Peking to Paris run.

Birtles drove more than 800,000 kms around and across Australia, and the world in many challenging car and cycle drives.

He was the first person to ride a bicycle 4,500 km across Australia, the first to circumnavigate Australia 16,000kms by bicycle, and the first to drive a car across Australia.

On the 1927 trip from London to Australia across post WW1 European battlefields he was often thinking of his mates buried there. Further along the trip in Sinai the car was frequently buried to the axles in sand-storms, and driving higher through the Persian Mountains Birtles faced snow storms and on reaching one snow covered mountain top he found a party of seven people sitting in a car frozen to death.

In Calcutta he took on as a passenger, a destitute Canadian tourist, Percy Stollery for company all the way to Melbourne. Other appalling conditions prevailed, such humidity in the tropics which rotted the clothes off their backs, and toadstools which grew in their blankets.

They emerged from the hot jungles exhausted after having been written off as dead. No one in England had heard from them for six weeks. In one tropical month they only travelled 58kms with 60 jungle covered hills along the way.

Birtles Bean was taken by oil tanker from Singapore to Darwin, and on arrival the customs people refused to allow the car into Australia. Only a telegram from Birtles to the Prime Minister Stanley Bruce saved the day and the car was released to head south to Brisbane, Sydney and Melbourne, where a crowd of 10,000 people mobbed Birtles and Stollery as they arrived at the Melbourne GPO.

Good morning, Bob.

Here is a guide to assist in the correct process of VVH registration. Also, I supplied a link to the Access Canberra Website for more information and attached a PDF information booklet containing the new guidelines regarding VVH vehicles.

Veteran, vintage, and historic motor vehicle registration (act.gov.au)

The following **must** book an Inspection at Hume Test Facility and have a current ACT Roadworthy Certificate.

- 1. Any car coming in from overseas (Imported vehicle first time registration in Australia and/or transfer from another state)
- 2. Any car with modifications that need an Engineers Certificate
- 3. Any car going onto CRS that in our Examiners opinion is questionable regarding period modifications.
- 4. Any vehicle is transferred into the Modified Historic category (unless it has already_been inspected by Access Canberra and has been accepted for full ACT registration)
- 5. VVH heavy vehicles and Modified Historic vehicles must be inspected at the Hume.

Converting from standard registration to VVH registration	Inspection
Currently ACT registered vehicle	No
Currently unregistered ACT vehicle (expired by less than 12 mg	onths) No
Currently unregistered (expired by more than 12 months)	Yes
Currently unregistered (cancelled registration)	Yes
Currently registered interstate	Yes
Transferring registration of a VVH registered vehicle (regardless of if the new operator is keeping the vehicle in VVH registration)	Yes
Currently VVH registered or unregistered vehicle converting back to standard ACT registration	Yes

A Roadworthy inspection is required for a VVH vehicle when:

- 1. It is registered in the ACT for the first time or registered after the vehicle's original registration has lapsed for 12 months or more.
- 2. There is a transfer of operatorship.

- 3. A vehicle is transferred into the Modified Historic category (unless it has already been inspected by Access Canberra and has been accepted for full ACT registration)
- 4. When transferring the vehicle from conditional registration to standard registration
- 5. When a defect notice is issued to the vehicle

VVH light vehicles under 4.5 tonnes can be inspected by any authorised inspection station. Authorised Inspection Stations are listed on the Access Canberra website <u>accesscanberra.act.gov.au.</u>

Light vehicles do not require annual inspections unless a change of ownership has occurred. Access Canberra and CACTMC strongly recommend that vehicles are checked annually by club-appointed examiners.

REDEX Reliability Trial 70th Anniversary re-run this coming August

The 1953 REDEX 'Reliability' Trial captured the imagination of the Australian public; it also demonstrated the capability and reliability of the 'modern' cars of that time.

To commemorate what was also known as the inaugural Round Australia Trial, the Peugeot Car Club of Victoria (PCCV) is planning to conduct a 70th Anniversary REDEX RERUN, basically a 3-day tour from Melbourne to Sydney – at this time scheduled to be from the 3-5 August. As much of the route as possible will be along the old Hume Highway alignment; except that it will include visiting Canberra on the second day and include the Marulan tie breaker stage on the final day.

In the first place, the re-run event will be open to car models that were onsale during the first half of the 1950s with a maximum entry of 60 cars. Also, initially 15 places will be reserved each for FX/FJ model Holdens and Peugeot 203s.

Members' help is therefore required to do this. Please advise the Membership Secretary, Richard Thwaites if:


• If you are taking a vehicle off ACT concessional registration.




