Alec McKernan memorial run - Goodwin Farrer to Royalla Common - Sunday 23 August

There was a very solid turn-out for the July run, which was tagged as a memorial for the late Alec McKernan. 59 people altogether took part, bring 26 vehicles, including 22 historic vehicles. A number of Alec's friends from outside the club also participated one way or another.

The run arose from an original suggestion by Joe Micallef, and was organised at the Royalla end by Malcolm Noad, with strong support from Wendy and other local members Bob and Helen Alexander, Jim Orman, and Ian Hooley.

Malcolm had organised for Alec's widow Anne and daughter Karen to be transported in style in Peter Sturgess' 1925 Bean – easily the most historic vehicle on the run.

Participants took off on a carefully-planned route from Goodwin Farrer retirement village to include a loop around the northern side of Pialligo and Queanbeyan and approach Royalla via Old Cooma road and Googong, rather than risking the Monaro Highway that can be crammed with snow traffic at this time of year. The convoy was quickly broken up by traffic lights, random turns, hill-climbing challenges and changes of mind. Nonetheless, almost all arrived in due course at the Royalla Common, via a range of unplanned routes.

Congratulations to the catering team, who coped with the challenge of a number of extra diners. We were also entertained with talks on the history of the Royalla location, the mysterious stone ruin, and the ancient harvesting machine on the site that Jim Orman explained is not an abandoned wreck, but rather an intriguing restoration project under his care.

Gerry Walker provided a heartfelt appreciation of Alec McKernan's character and contribution to the club and its members over many years. The event and the raffle of a beautiful quilt made and donated by Anne McKernan, raised over \$900 for the charity project nominated in Alec's name.

1958 DODGE POWER WAGON

"1945. Young GI's were returning from World War II and the nation was experiencing an explosion in manufacturing and agricultural capacity ignited by the beginning of the war 4 years earlier. The country was finally pulling itself up and dusting itself off from the effects of the 1930's and the Great Depression of not so many years before. The country was growing more modern, more mobile, and more capable. There were roads to build, rural regions to electrify, timber to harvest, and mouths to feed. The timing was perfect for a new vehicle that would haul the heavy loads where there were no roads, plow the fields, and complete the various tasks to come.

Chrysler Corporation saw this need and answered the call with the introduction of the new 4-wheel-drive Dodge Power-Wagon in 1946. The truck truly embodied form follows function design. This, in part based on its intent as "a truck, a tractor, and a portable power plant, all in one," and also due in part to its military ancestry."

Production occurred from about 1945 to 1980 (Up to 1968 domestically then exported under a Govt programme). Various different designations were assigned to military / civilian models during this time. Export vehicles were rebadged as "Fargo" and "De Soto".

The Power Wagon was based on the 3/4 tonne Army truck chassis with a civilian cab and purpose designed 8 foot cargo box. It had a 125 inch (3,200mm) wheelbase chassis and a 230 cubic inch flat head six engine, a 2 speed transfer case, 4 speed transmission with a power take off that could provide power to the front and rear for auxiliary equipment. Tyres were 9.00/16-8 ply tyres on 16x6 50inch 5-stud wheels.

The engine was later upgraded to a 251 and then larger engines were also added after that. The nominal one-tonne rated Power Wagon's gross vehicle weight rating (GVWR) was 8,700 pounds, later models it changed to 9,500 pounds.

Most of their production life Power Wagons remained unchanged with the exceptional of incremental improvements so interchangeability of parts was good.

Initial base price in the USA was about USD \$1,627 which put it in a higher price bracket where its main client were government departments. The largest customer was the US Forestry Commission.

A total of 95,145 WDX-WM300 Power Wagons were sold domestically between

1946 and 1968.

Lots more interesting facts and unique aspects of this vehicle can be found online.

HISTORY OF THIS POWER WAGON

My power wagon is a 1958 model and its number from RAAF records is No.48 of about 55 that were transported in parts to Australia and assembled in Keswick in 1958 specifically for the RAAF. This batch of Power Wagons are noted in RAAF records as being purposed as weapons carriers. Its original colour was blue/grey.

Connecting the dots as to the vehicles history was aided by the RAAF museum at Point Cook (who verified the vehicle on their records and dates of assignment), the seller whom I purchased it from who mentioned it may have been with the Dapto fire service (prior to being sold to the person he purchased it from in Victoria) and Harvey Bailey, who was Captain of the Dapto bush fire brigade for about 38 years, also travelled down to Canberra to see the vehicle in person and confirm it was the same one used by his brigade and also provide a lot of the historical details filling in the gaps prior to its sale to the Victorian purchaser.

*There were also other power Wagons in the RAAF, apparently there were about 9 that were designated "Truck Early Rescue" (TER) and were used as Fire/emergency support vehicles. They were painted yellow/red.

*The seller whom I purchased my Power Wagon from had only just sold an original RAAF Fire Service silver fire suite / head mask he had to a person that is currently refurbishing an original TER Power Wagon in Victoria.

*Other Australian users of Power Wagons were the Snowy Mountain Authority (SMA) and the Post Master General (PMG).

Good morning, Bob.

Here is a guide to assist in the correct process of VVH registration. Also, I supplied a link to the Access Canberra Website for more information and attached a PDF information booklet containing the new guidelines regarding VVH vehicles.

Veteran, vintage, and historic motor vehicle registration (act.gov.au)

The following **must** book an Inspection at Hume Test Facility and have a current ACT Roadworthy Certificate.

- 1. Any car coming in from overseas (Imported vehicle first time registration in Australia and/or transfer from another state)
- 2. Any car with modifications that need an Engineers Certificate
- 3. Any car going onto CRS that in our Examiners opinion is questionable regarding period modifications.
- 4. Any vehicle is transferred into the Modified Historic category (unless it has already_been inspected by Access Canberra and has been accepted for full ACT registration)
- 5. VVH heavy vehicles and Modified Historic vehicles must be inspected at the Hume.

Converting from standard registration to VVH registration	Inspection
Currently ACT registered vehicle	No
Currently unregistered ACT vehicle (expired by less than 12 mg	onths) No
Currently unregistered (expired by more than 12 months)	Yes

Transferring registration of a VVH registered vehicle (regardless of if the new operator is keeping the vehicle in VVH registration)	Yes
Currently VVH registered or unregistered vehicle converting back to standard ACT registration	Yes

A Roadworthy inspection is required for a VVH vehicle when:

- 1. It is registered in the ACT for the first time or registered after the vehicle's original registration has lapsed for 12 months or more.
- 2. There is a transfer of operatorship.

- 3. A vehicle is transferred into the Modified Historic category (unless it has already been inspected by Access Canberra and has been accepted for full ACT registration)
- 4. When transferring the vehicle from conditional registration to standard registration
- 5. When a defect notice is issued to the vehicle

VVH light vehicles under 4.5 tonnes can be inspected by any authorised inspection station. Authorised Inspection Stations are listed on the Access Canberra website <u>accesscanberra.act.gov.au.</u>

Light vehicles do not require annual inspections unless a change of ownership has occurred. Access Canberra and CACTMC strongly recommend that vehicles are checked annually by club-appointed examiners.

The 1953 REDEX 'Reliability' Trial captured the imagination of the Australian public; it also demonstrated the capability and reliability of the 'modern' cars of that time.

To commemorate what was also known as the inaugural Round Australia Trial, the Peugeot Car Club of Victoria (PCCV) is planning to conduct a 70th Anniversary REDEX RERUN, basically a 3-day tour from Melbourne to Sydney – at this time scheduled to be from the 3-5 August. As much of the route as possible will be along the old Hume Highway alignment; except that it will include visiting Canberra on the second day and include the Marulan tie breaker stage on the final day.

Members' help is therefore required to do this. Please advise the Membership Secretary, Richard Thwaites if:


• If you are taking a vehicle off ACT concessional registration.




