Brett Robinson's 1977 Holden Premier and Richard Thwaites' 1953 Daimler Conquest attracted some curiousity.


After safely navigating the fairly steep pinches in and out of the Murrumbidgee Valley, first at Uriarra Crossing, and then at Taemus Bridge, the Thwaites Daimler lost all brakes on Wee Jasper Road approaching Yass. In drizzling rain, it was able to coast in low gear down the main street of Yass till, with engine switched off, we could bump fairly gently into the kerb outside the Public Toilets near the Yass Information Centre. Brett Robinson, Neil Buttriss and David Nielsen offered help and advice. A clevis pin had dropped out of the main brake control rod above the rear axle. leaving all brakes effectively



disconnected. After consideration of options, Neil made a mercy dash to a local hardware shop and got a 1/4inch high tensile bolt that Brett then used to replace the missing clevis pin. Progress was resumed to catch up with the others at the Rollonin Cafe.

Thanks to the rescue team from Richard and Dilber!

The Rollonin Cafe is a rebuilt slab hut on the old Hume Highway (now Bowning Road) at Bowning, with history going back to at least the 1840s to an adjacent Cobb & Co coaching station. Everyone enjoyed their visit and the run with a good range of cars from oldish to pretty new (by CACMC standards).

1973 Landau Article - John Neilsen

My first exposure to the Ford Landau was in 1973 when I was working in the spare parts section of a Ford dealership. They received a brand-new Landau, white in colour, a black vinyl roof and black interior. I was most taken with the console, with three aeroplane style levers - they only turned out to be the controls for the heater and air-conditioning!

It wasn't until 2008 that I was reintroduced to the Landaus. I sold a Falcon GT Hardtop and was looking for an XA, XB or XC Hardtop Falcon to replace it. Unfortunately, prices for these models were outside my budget. Searching the internet, I came across a Landau located in Canberra. It was a complete car and had not been started for a number of years. It also came with many spares and included a reconditioned engine and gearbox. It was not long before the Landau was made roadworthy and registered.

During the following years my Landau collection grew to three. At the 2012 Wheels show, all three Landau's were displayed (photo below). I was approached by a man who had been showing interest in my Landaus. He informed me that his father (Glen) owned a Landau which had been in the family since the mid-70s and he was thinking of selling it. Names and contact details were exchanged.



Having not heard anything for months I decided to contact the owner's son. He explained the family had just finished moving house and the Landau was now for sale and available for viewing. The Landau (photos below) was located in Forbes NSW and arrangements were made with Glen to inspect the vehicle.

On arrival the Landau was parked outside the house and looked very nice with a rural backdrop of rolling hills and grazing sheep. We were welcomed by the owners who provided country hospitality with freshly made tea, cakes and biscuits. Glen explained the Landau was purchased in Sydney by his mother and had been in the family ever since.





Upon initial inspection, the Landau displayed a number of unique and interesting features including; an early build date, an electric sunroof, hounds tooth interior (photos below) and alloy mag wheels. Glen explained this was the way the vehicle was purchased. Unfortunately, the price was outside of my budget and I declined the offer to buy the Landau.





However, armed with all the VIN details of the Landau, I commenced researching the history of the Landau. This information was forwarded to the owner to assist with the sale.

During the following months, I was always curious if the Landau had sold. Late in 2013, I was contacted by the owner's son, who advised that the Landau was still for sale and I was to have first offer. However, I mentioned that if the price was the same, I would decline. The son stated that Glen wanted to sell and the price was negotiable. Another phone call was made to Glen to discuss the Landau, with the intention of buying it.

In March 2014, we drove to Forbes to collect the Landau. On arrival, the Landau was sitting outside, shining in the sunshine. Glen informed me that he had washed the Landau, checked the oil and water and it had plenty of fuel. Laughing, he said that for years, he was going to straighten the aerial but never got around to it! The return drive to Canberra was uneventful, the Landau cruising with the comfort of a lounge chair. The only negative being the bonnet badge. It was off another Ford which was replaced as soon as we got home.

As the Landau spent the majority of its time in country NSW one thing was apparent – it was very dirty. Due to the Landau travelling on country dirt roads for most of its life, the amount of red dust, dirt, oil and grass seeds certainly added to its character! (photos below)





Having decided to take my time and approach the Landau in an orderly manner, the next few months consisted of researching the history, looking at what needed fixing or replacing and where best to start. Fortunately, the Landau was very original, complete, driveable and without rust. Based on this, I made the decision to start at the rear of the Landau and work my way forward, ensuring I finished the task at hand before moving on.

Starting at the rear, the bumper, lights and bright work were removed, cleaned, painted if necessary and replaced. The boot itself was full of dust, which was ingrained into the paint. The interior was removed, floors cleaned, carpet shampooed, and seats vacuumed and cleaned. The engine bay was next, but I had developed a system which was working well. The engine was cleaned with brushes and kerosine and some parts were replaced including water pump, reconditioned carburettor and radiator. The front grille, headlights and bumper were the last to be completed. The amount of dust is hard to describe, but it was consistent throughout the car.





During the cleaning of the Landau, I was referencing the January 1974 Wheels Magazine, which had done a road test on a Landau. There was a colour picture of a Landau, similar in colour to mine and an aerial with an angle similar to mine – Glen's words came to mind! It raised a question – could my Landau be the one in the Wheels magazine? I had to follow this thought.

In Victoria, there is a group called, 'The Association of Motoring Clubs' (AOMC). Due to privacy laws, VicRoads, provided AOMC, with all records of every vehicle registered in Victoria since 1900's to early 1980's. However, no ownership details are available. For a fee, AOMC need the engine number of the car and if it is in their records, they can provide the make of the vehicle, registration number, when it was first registered and if the registration was changed.

This was an opportunity not to be missed, so I sent my request to AOMC. Shortly after, I received written confirmation that my Landau was indeed the Landau used for the Wheels magazine road test car. AOMC confirmed my engine number matched the registration number, LMP622, which was in the Wheels magazine.

My research of the Landau is as follows:

- Ford records confirm the Landau is Walnut Glow in colour, saddle interior, brown vinyl roof, radio stereo/tape player and the retail dealer code is; Ford Special Vehicles (3999).
- From available information, it is believed to be the 5th Landau built, in April 1973.
- The Ford Retail Dealer code 3999, is for internal use or marketing purposes.
- The Landau was first registered in Victoria on 8 June 1973 by Ford Australia LMP 622.
- Ford Australia officially notified the release of the Landau on 22 June 1973.
- No further information is known about this Landau until September 1973.
- On the 14 September 1973, the Wheels Magazine used the Landau as the 'road test' vehicle for the January 1974 edition of the Wheels Magazine (photos below). Note: The Landau was sold new prior to the magazine release.



It is not known when or where the sunroof and interior were fitted to the Landau, however it was after the Wheels Road Test and prior to the new owners purchasing the vehicle.

The Landau was delivered to an unknown NSW Sydney Ford dealer. A husband and wife purchased the Landau in November 1973. Discussions with the wife confirmed the Landau was purchased as a new vehicle with the electric sunroof, houndstooth interior and standard wheels with turbine hubcaps. Following a boating accident, the husband was unable to drive the Landau. His wife learnt to drive it, however found it too big. They traded the Landau on a smaller car in early 1974.

Newspaper advertisements from March - May 1974, show that the Landau was for sale at Geoghegans Recreational Vehicles, Haberfield, NSW. The advertisements (photos below) clearly indicate the electric sunroof, houndstooth interior and alloy spoked wheels (ROH Pro Sprints), which appear to have been dealer fitted.

The NSW family purchased the Landau in 1974 and it remained in the family to 2014.

.....

Since purchasing the Landau in March 2014, it has undergone a refurbishment, as opposed to a restoration. Many hours have been spent cleaning, repairing and replacing parts as required. The objective is to present the Landau as an original and well-maintained vehicle.

In July 2016, the refurbishment was completed and the Landau was driven and shown to the original owner. Except for the alloy wheels, the Landau was as she remembered it.


