Club Members' Vehicles

A different type of heirloom

For many families, heirlooms may consist of small trinkets or keepsakes passed down from generation to generation, however this is not always the case.

For Malcolm Ridley, his choice of family heirloom took the form of a 1929 Chevrolet Truck. Malcolm comes from a rural farming family in NSW (not far from West Wyalong) and this truck has been in his family since the 1930's.

During the Christmas period, Malcolm took the opportunity to talk with his mum about the truck to discover more about it.

While the truck has no chassis number to speak of Chevrolet didn't introduce their inline sixcylinder model until 1929 so the truck itself cannot be earlier than 1929.

It's been a working truck all its life and was originally purchased new by the Lynch family from Clear Ridge near West Wyalong. They disposed of it during the Great Depression to

Frederick and Elizabeth Halliwell (Malcolm's great grandparents) who used it to haul grain to Wamboyne siding.

Frederick's son, 'Fred' purchased the truck from his father in 1949 and it was then used to haul grain to the Burcher silos up until the 1950s. Interestingly it was not unusual practise to load the truck with up to 3 tons of grain (36 bags) making the truck extremely overloaded.

To get the extra weight on the truck, the bags were stacked on end and then more bags piled on top. This probably explains why the back window of the truck has been filled in and a steel 'l' beam has been attached to the front axle to manage the extra weight and provide

some much-needed strength. The truck also carted hay during this period.

After acquiring a green Austin in 1952 and then trading that for a red Morris in 1960. Fred continued to use the Chev as a general runabout, as the other trucks took on more of the heavier work. The family still have Fred's red Morris on blocks at the farm and it was last running in the 1980s.







As for the Chev truck, this was last running in 1979 when Fred got it running so that it could appear in a parade at the Burcher 50 year celebrations for the arrival of the railway. Malcolm has fond memories as a 10-year-old lad of riding in the back of the truck in the parade It was at this time that Malcolm's grandmother (Vera Halliwell) hand-painted the Chev using off the shelf paint colours to as near to the original green and black as she could get.

The truck has been passed down through the family to Malcolm's mum Irene who can remember driving it as a girl. The truck was eventually parked up alongside the Morris, (which according to Malcolm may also have its day at the hands of a restorer!).

So why this truck in particular? Malcolm had always known about this truck and had seen his grandfather driving it around the farm. Malcolm is preserving a tangible piece of his family's farming history, and as a tribute to his grandfather and family. The truck also has nice lines and there aren't many of them left now, so why not!

The truck is in the process of being stripped down and restored. The motor has gone off to a company in Melbourne to be rebuilt and Malcolm is keen to learn how to maintain it in the future.

This is likely to be a long restoration which we will follow with great interest so expect more updates in the future.

More recently with the assistance of the Wagga Wagga Classic Motor Club, Malcolm has been put in touch with another 1929 Chev truck owner. A big thank you to our friends at Wagga Wagga for their help.

Just one final thought...

With the number of commercial trucks owned or being restored by CACMC members, a trip to the Australian Road Transport Heritage Centre in Gundagai may be appropriate – either that or the Club could start a vintage trucking company!!!!



A sucker for punishment....

Our club covers a wide range of vehicles, and also has several caravans listed on its vehicle register, so I thought I'd tell you about mine.

In 2013 my stepson needed a place to live and so my wife and I sourced a caravan. Having no money at the time, a zero-cost option was the only way to go. Of course, this option came with some drawbacks.

On an online site we were offered a caravan for free, on the proviso that we picked it up and relocated it. The location was a property near Yass. So we dutifully went out and had a look at it, and for most people they would have turned round and walked away. The caravan had been sitting for a while in a paddock and was a bit worse for wear. Broken windows had meant that the birds had used it for a roost, and the end panels had become detached and were open to the weather. It was, (for want of a better expression) a renovator's delight!!!!



(I'm being polite here!!!).

(I really should have walked away at this point!), but no, I was up for a challenge. How hard could fixing up a caravan be? So we organised a flat bed tow truck to pick it up and it was delivered back to our home.

After cleaning out all the mess, I started to evaluate the project in front of me. The caravan was a 14ft

1960s Viscount Valiant, made in Sydney. (I was to discover a lot more about Vintage Caravans as the project went on). A bit of research indicated that the frame was wooden (yay for me as I could utilise my carpentry skills learnt from my grandfather and at school – those joint making classes would come in handy after all!!!).

I started by removing the old rain-soaked interior roof panels, quickly followed by other mouldy interior panels, and anything else that couldn't be salvaged (a skip would have been handy at this point!). To get to the frame, all the windows were removed as well as the exterior cladding. The frame itself wasn't too bad, BUT, the framework responsible for holding the back and front of the van on was almost non-existent. (I was lucky that we hadn't lost a window on the way home). The repairs (if that's what you could call them) done on site by the previous owner consisted of 6 inch nails banged through the cladding in the vain hope of keeping things together. (as if!!!)

I sought advice from many vintage caravan owners online, joined a few caravan restoration groups and learnt as much as I could about vintage vans. I rebuilt the damaged sections of framing using

Meranti, traditional techniques and lots of brass screws. I reinforced the corners using 12mm marine ply and rebuilt the framing for the windows.

When the van framing was robust enough I split the body from the chassis and set about

repairing and replacing the rusted sections - particularly the z rails which were the main supports the caravan attached to. New ones were ordered and made up by Hertzog Steel in Fyshwick and a mate came and welded them back in for me. The chassis was given a nice coat of bitumen paint and reunited with the body.

While I had the cladding off I organised a sparky to come over and rewire the van to code, putting new breakers and powerpoints in.

Bit by bit I re-assembled the van, insulating it as I went (most old vans don't have insulation

so they are either metal ovens in the summer or ice boxes in the winter). New windows were made from 3mm laminate and installed. (Putting new window rubbers in is a prize pain!). All joints were sealed using Sikaflex and new lights added, brakes were replaced and new bearings fitted. The interior was painted, new curtains made and new soft furnishings added. (Big mistake if you are letting a teenager use it!!!).

In total the van took about 12 months to rebuild from the time we picked it up. I could have done it guicker if I'd had the money to throw at it, but this wasn't an option. In the end my stepson used the van as a temporary home until he was able to move on. My wife and I have used the van once

since then and learnt a thing or two about caravanning. Unfortunately, its now too small for















us (we have recently taken on two german shepherd rescues, so we need room for them in the future).

You would have thought I would have learnt from this experience, but as I said in the beginning – I must be a sucker for punishment. We recently bought a 1972 Viscount Ambassador that needs a refurb, but that's a whole new chapter and my major project for 2024.

One final thought,, you could say that the restoration has been... "A Valiant Effort"!

Mark Critchley's 1974 Chrysler (Valiant) VJ Charger 770

Ever since Mark started to drive in 1994, he has driven and owned Chrysler Valiants. This is the second Charger he has owned, the first being a 1972 VH Charger 770 with a 318ci Fireball engine.

Mark purchased his current Charger in 2001 and back then it had a 6-cylinder (hemi 245ci) configuration. With the body sporting a bit of rust in the usual areas, a rough paint job, tattered interior and a dodgy drivetrain, the car was a prime candidate for a restoration.

Over the next 8 years the vehicle was gutted and stripped back to bare metal with all the rust removed and resprayed white using a 2-pack paint (replacing the original light blue colour).

The drivetrain was replaced with a 360ci engine, 727 Torqueflite transmission and 9" differential. The engine was fully rebuilt in 2010 due to poor initial assembly and substandard parts which resulted in bore damage. The engine now runs great and is at 412ci. To stop the car, the brakes were upgraded to disc brakes all round.

The interior has been re-trimmed in black, keeping with the original style using as much of the original trim as possible.

The wheels are now 16" five spoke rims, due to the disc brake/calliper upgrades as the original 14" wheels no longer fit.

Although the Valiant drives very well and attracts attention everywhere it goes, it is currently unregistered as Mark is having issues with ACT inspection processes. He hopes to have these addressed (and some other repairs) completed soon.

As Mark is a member of the ADF the vehicle is well travelled. It has been registered in NSW, NT, SA and QLD. (and shortly in the ACT) leaving only VIC, WA and Tas for Mark to get the complete set!

Our magazine beginning from 2011 is already available in digitised format that can be searched on both the Club Site and the Heritage Library site. 

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

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
