#### **CLUB MEMBERS' VEHICLES**

#### Marea Georgiou's - 1992 Honda Prelude

#### Model SI SRS, BB2 / H23A1 4th Generation

I purchased this vehicle in 1994 with approximately 20,000 kms and have owned the car ever since. The vehicle has a little over 90,000 kms at the moment.

Unfortunately, due to circumstances, and the purchase of a Mazda CX-5, the Honda remained under cover on the driveway for around six years undisturbed, apart from a few spiders, cobwebs and the occasional vermin finding shelter. I just didn't have the heart to part with her all these years for sentimental reasons. The vehicle has never been 'hooned' but driven with respect and pride. In fact, I must be such a good driver that after 30 years the car still had its original tyres and mags with plenty of tread left on them, plus original brake pads which were hardly worn out. Due to age of the tyres they had developed 'old age' cracks and wrinkles (a bit like me:), as had the brake pads which have since been replaced. A friend fitted low-profile tyres and snazzier mags which improved the car's appearance somewhat!



When I found out that I would now be able to obtain Historic Number Plates for the vehicle as she was about to have her 30<sup>th</sup> Birthday I thought this might be an opportunity to resurrect her and bring some life back into the car and myself. It reminds me of my younger days when I enjoyed driving the car around with the sunroof open and the feel of a well made sports car behind the steering wheel.



So when the decision was made to bring this lady 'back from the land of the living dead' she was towed away to a mechanical shop, which in hindsight was the wrong choice, as they had no experience with this type of vehicle and the complexities of 4WS and other issues with the model vehicle. I was informed that the fuel tank was full of rust and the it was the worst they had ever seen. They had no solution and as I am a problem solver I decided to venture into the land of second hand car part dealers and having the response to my enquiry to find another fuel tank sound like a broken record, 'sorry can't help you, scarce as hen's teeth' plus most of the car wreckers punch holes in the fuel tanks. I made hundreds of calls nationwide that day and then Optus went down not long after. I would

jokingly say to people I think I brought Optus down with all the calls I made yesterday!

Well my perseverance paid off and I found someone through Facebook who was wrecking a Honda Prelude 1995 VT-IR in Lismore. He was very helpful and removed the fuel tank to check his didn't have rust inside and sent me photos. When the photos of the inside of his fuel tank arrived I was fully expecting to have the same situation with rust in the tank as his car has been sitting there for a few years also. But to my utter surprise when I received the photos from inside of his fuel tank it almost looked like it was 'gold plated' inside. So good to get a

break sometimes and have positive results! By the way I also found it highly amusing in his reply messages when he would say 'no worries dude' as he didn't think a female owned the car. Transporting the fuel tank was another long saga of telephone and online enquiries with most freight companies quoting up to \$800 to transport the item to Canberra. Fortunately I found a company which had a depot in Lismore (Direct Freight if I recall correctly) which transported it for \$60 and the guy was kind enough to box it up and drop it off at the Lismore depot.

So the mechanics were pleased to hear I managed to source another fuel tank and were so impressed offered me either a job or a cheeky marriage proposal lol. To my utter surprise they passed the Roadworthy test and received the certificate to be able to obtain the Historic Car Registration. There are quite a few teething problems with the vehicle and I am in the process of trying to find a local mechanic that is familiar with this vintage model of Honda Prelude. A new Gates timing belt/water pump kit has been ordered and I have viewed numerous Youtube videos regarding different issues with this model car and ways to resolve them. The US, UK and Germany love Honda Preludes apparently so there are lots of videos/info in different Prelude forums as well, which can be overwhelming.

For example, the 4WS light comes on after a few kilometres. According to many other 4th Generation Prelude owners 90 per cent of the time this is resolved by removing the 4WS module located behind one of the back seats and 'resoldering' a certain section which forms 'fissures' in the existing solder over time. The ABS light comes on regularly and this is a matter

of cleaning the speed sensors etc. It is a bit disconcerting when all these lights come up on the dash as you are driving, but hopefully these issues will be resolved with time.

Giving this car a new lease of life has encouraged me to clean out the other side of my garage which was just a lot of junk that was overdue to be thrown out. Hoping to get her out from under the car cover and in the garage within the new few weeks!

By the way I am using Fuel Doctor in the fuel tank. Stops petrol going off for a couple of years and diesel for up to 60 months, clears fuel line and injectors as well.







#### Peter Schwarz's RX7

Peter's car is a 1989 Mazda RX7 series V convertible and is a jap import. The series 4 and 5 are the  $2^{nd}$  generation of the RX7 and are also known as the FC3S.

Peter's is a *Savannah* which is the fully optioned Japanese version. The Savannah's came with full leather interior and factory BBS wheels, manual



Turbo. The car came as you see it now though (imported from Japan) with the Work Equip alloy wheels.

It is a 13b Turbo, 5 speed manual and Peter has owned it for nearly 14 years.

This is the 12<sup>th</sup> or 13<sup>th</sup> Rotary engined car he has owned. Up until this car, all his previous Rotaries were usually his daily drivers.

While the FC convertibles were an Australian delivered option, the Turbo was only ever offered in Australia as an Auto so manual FC convertible with factory Turbos are not that common here

They were manufactured between 1988 and 1991 (there was a limited run of 500 in 1992 for the Japanese market only) and there were only 22,000 manufactured in total world wide.

The convertible RX7's were designed from the chassis up as a convertible and were not just a coupe that was simply modified as a convertible. The chassis and body have extra strengthening incorporated into them and they were manufactured on their own assembly line.

This vehicle was also the first car to incorporate the "wind blocker" to reduce wind in the passenger compartment and patented by Mazda and it was the first vehicle where the fold





down roof was installed as a single prebuilt unit.

The 2 part hard top is also a little unique in that the retractable roof is made in 2 parts, one section is a hard top that can be removed and the car then can be driven as a targa top.

advertisements for vehicles & parts, pictures of members vehicles, club runs & events, and any other relevant information.


This will also have the benefit of allowing us all to interact with each other more, through the ability for all members of the page to comment and correspond with others in the Club.



#### DID YOU KNOW ...!

#### Is a taxi/cab a car, or is it just called a taxi or the other word cab?

Okay, here's an interesting piece of linguistics.



This, in French at least, is a "cabriolet", a light carriage drawn by one horse designed to carry one to two people, plus maybe a driver. It has a hood to protect the occupants from inclement weather. This sort of vehicle spread through many urban areas in Europe, including England, where they gave it the same name. They were commonly used as vehicles for hire to traverse short distances quickly. In London, they started to replace the larger and slower "hackneys". This was a very long word and was often shortened to "cab" and was applied to other horse drawn vehicles for hire, such as:



Hackney cab



Hansom cab

Hackney cabs (note the big slow horse instead of a fast one), and Hansom cabs.

But part of the problem was how to calculate the fare. In the late 19th century, as automobiles were introduced, a German fellow named F.W.G. Bruhn developed a device that could keep track of the fare as the vehicle traveled. It was called a "taxameter" (charge meter) which when



introduced to France was changed to "taximeter". By 1897, Gottlieb Daimler attached the taximeter to an automobile which became *The Taximeter Cabriolet which* was eventually shortened to "Taxicab" or "Taxi" or "Cab" depending where in the world you were at the time.





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
