Jim was the proud owner of a 1928 Whippet Tourer, a 1929 Austin 7 and a 1936 Chrysler. Club member Ray Gallagher has provided has some happy memories of his interest in Austins:

"Jim was always to participate in the Austins Over Australia Rallies extending as far as Perth. As Club President he provided assistance to the successful 2007 Rally in Canberra.

A Rally not to be forgotten was the 2013 Rally in Bendigo. On arrival in Bendigo Jim discovered the battery in the Austin had collapsed and another was not available ,it was Easter. However Jim went to enjoy the events in Bendigo including the celebrations with his Club friends of his 80° Birthday.

The return Journey on Easter Monday, 1 April, also was unforgettable. The trailer Jim used to transport his Austin enclosed the car. Coming up a hill near Holbrook the car slipped off the trailer and ended up against the Guard rail in the centre of the Highway. It sustained some damage to RH mudguards and Running board.

Phone calls to Jim alerting him to the loss of the car were initially greeted with "I know it's April Fools Day ".

Eventually he turned back and we were able to secure the car on the trailer and the rest of the trip home was uneventful. The loss of a good friend."

In more recent times he had hip replacement problems and to help his independence he invested in a battery powered mobility device that looked a little like a 3 wheel motorbike. However in 2021 he moved into a nursing home and had a number of health issues. Sadly on 11 Nov 2023 he passed away. His widow Rhonda commented that his mind was good to the end, but his body finally gave out. Rest in Peace.

#### David Evans' 1974 Ford Escort

David's Ford Escort has been in the family since new and it only has 70,000km on the clock. For its age it's not doing too bad. David has discovered a little bit of rust worm in the floors and under the driver's seat but this should be an easy fix.

The upholstery needs a little attention and he's identified an issue with the fuel gauge which presents some challenges as he has to fill up and then calculate the usage per Km, not an ideal situation. The car runs well, and the bodywork is maintaining its shine despite losing the protection of a garage. For now, the two car covers are providing some protection. Recently shown at Wheels 2024, David said that his escort garnered as much attention as the Bristol parked beside it.



The Mk II Escort was assembled at Ford Australia's Homebush Plant, Sydney from March 1975 to 1980 in 2-door and 4-door sedan, and 2-door panel van forms – the estate versions were unavailable to the Australian market.

The sedan models were available in L, XL (later renamed GL) and Ghia forms, and a Sport pack option – similar to the 1300 and 1600 Sport models sold elsewhere. Unlike other markets – likely due to the estate's absence – the van was offered in a higher level of trim – a GL, and a Sport pack van was also available. Unusual fitments for the range not offered elsewhere on the Australian Escort included 'dog-dish' steel hubcaps, and high-backed front seats.[source: Wikipedia]



A field of classic Ford Cortinas, one of Australia's legendary cars, will race it out at 47th Historic Winton on Saturday 25th May.

The race is a collaboration between Historic Winton, the Historic Touring Car Association of Victoria (HTCV) and Cortina Mk 1 Owners Club.

Secretary of the HTCV Jim Collins said that the Mk1 Cortina has been one of the most popular cars racing in Historic Touring Cars since it was first released in 1963.

"How better to celebrate the 60 plus years of competition than to have a "Cortina Challenge" feature race on the short track at the Historic Winton meeting where numerous drivers would have had their first experience of historic racing," Jim said. "The challenge is open to all Mk1 Cortina Group Nb and Nc class log booked competition vehicles."

He said that after promoting the concept of the "Cortina Challenge" to various Mk1 Cortina drivers they think it is a great idea and they are all looking forward to the event and especially their own feature race.

"The Winton short circuit used for Historic Winton has always been considered ideal for the Cortina. The drivers will be checking that they will have the right diff ratio for their car and brakes are in excellent working order before the event," Jim said.

Like the previous Mini Dash, Historic Winton introduced special 'type-only' races onto the program a couple of years ago.

Historic Winton race secretary, Peta Lee said that Cortinas have always been uncompromising competitors in the Group N touring car races against all sorts of hard-top cars, big and small.

"Spectators enjoy seeing much beloved, former everyday vehicles race and it draws quite a crowd," Peta Lee said. "Cortinas were a small, family car that was Ford's competitor to the Holden Torana.

"In fact, there have been some edge-of-your-seat moments in the past in the Group N events, with Minis and Cortinas entering into close battle, so it will be interesting to see just how competitive Cortina against Cortina becomes."

The 47<sup>th</sup> Historic Winton, Australia's longest running and most popular historic car and motorcycle race event, will be held on 25<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> May 2024 at Winton Motor Raceway, near Benalla.


This will also have the benefit of allowing us all to interact with each other more, through the ability for all members of the page to comment and correspond with others in the Club.





