Dear Mr Jackson,

I am pleased to inform the Council of ACT Motor Clubs and your representative members that the ACT Government will implement new arrangements for the registration of Veteran, Vintage and Historic (VVH) vehicles.

These changes will improve the arrangements for those already registered in the VVH scheme. They will also provide more registered operators with access to these arrangements and so increase the opportunity for vehicle owners and car enthusiasts to use and enjoy their vehicles.

ACT specialty car club members have made a number of representations to myself and Minister Mick Gentleman about additional possible inclusions in the scheme, including the opportunity to fit registration plates other than VVH specific plates. I am pleased to say that these inclusions have been considered and agreed.

The significant changes to the VVH registration arrangements that the ACT Government will deliver include:

conditions for vehicles registered under the conditional VVH vehicle registration arrangements will be changed from the existing distance-based limit to a day-based limit. This will allow vehicle owners to drive their cars for up to 60 days use per year in addition to motor vehicle club activities. Registered operators of VVH vehicles will be required to complete a logbook at the start of each day's use to enable enforcement of the scheme by authorised

officers and police.

- the introduction of a modified historic class for VVH vehicles.
- to any registration plate eligible for use in the ACT being used on vehicles registered under the VVH arrangements, while VVH registration plates will continue to be available.

The Government is currently working towards implementation of these updates to registration for VVH vehicles. The timeframe for implementation is linked to the need for systems upgrades by Access Canberra, which are being delivered in the context of significant ongoing service needs generated by the COVID-19 pandemic.

The ACT Government will make further announcements on the timeframe for implementation in the coming months but expects to have these changes and the scheme in place by the end of 2022.

Thank you for the ongoing advocacy of CACTMC and your component member clubs on this issue. I trust this information is of assistance.



Itinerary: Motoring Heritage Day Meet the People Cruise 15 May 2022

For National Motoring Heritage Day again we cruise around the heritage sites of Canberra and areas with plenty of pedestrians. The aim is VISI-BILITY for our historic vehicles.

The itinerary has some differences from last year, due to changed traffic conditions.

10am Gather in carpark at top of Red Hill at end of Red Hill Drive. NB the Restaurant and Coffee Shop are currently CLOSED - BYO coffee/tea if you plan to socialise there.

10:30-ish

- Coast down Red Hill. At the <u>first roundabout TURN RIGHT</u> into Mugga Way.
- Follow Mugga Way (past Calthorpes' House on the right) to Flinders Way.
- At <u>Flinders Way TURN LEFT</u>. Follow Flinders Way down into Manuka.
- At <u>Franklin St TURN LEFT</u> and pass through the cafe strip.
- At Furneaux St TURN RIGHT in front of St Christopher's church.
- At <u>Manuka Circle TURN LEFT</u> to pass by Manuka Oval and follow Canberra Ave
- At State Circle TURN LEFT around State Circle.
- At Melbourne Avenue TURN RIGHT up to Parliament House.
- At <u>Parliament Drive TURN RIGHT</u> to follow Parliament Drive around to the front of Parliament House.
- In front of Parliament House take the <u>dogleg to Federation Mall West</u>. <u>Turn RIGHT at Federation Mall</u> and proceed down to the back of Old Parliament House (Museum of Australian Democracy).
- At <u>Queen Victoria Terrace TURN RIGHT</u> and follow around the 180 degree curve (near King's Avenue) till it becomes King George Terrace. Follow King George Terrace across the front of Old Parliament House.
- At Parkes Place West TURN RIGHT.

- Cross King Edward Terrace and continue until you <u>TURN RIGHT at Queen Elizabeth Terrace</u> (lakefront shared roadway with pedestrians). Past the High Court this turns right into Parkes Place West and takes you up between the High Court and the National Gallery, back to King Edward Terrace.
- At <u>King Edward Terrace TURN LEFT</u> and follow it to merge onto Kings Avenue, heading north.
- After Kings Avenue Bridge, continue straight over Parkes Way till you pass Bugs Bunny on your right. Turn LEFT then FIRST RIGHT round the Defence buildings, to a T-junction with Constitution Avenue.
- At <u>Constitution Avenue TURN LEFT</u> and follow it till you reach Anzac Parade.
- At Anzac Parade TURN RIGHT and follow it to the top.
- At Limestone Avenue TURN LEFT.
- At <u>Girrahween Street (Haig Park) TURN LEFT</u>, follow it around Haig Park, Braddon.
- At <u>Lonsdale Sttreet TURN LEFT</u> and follow it through Braddon. Cross Cooyong St and follow Genge St through to Bunda Street.
- TURN LEFT at Bunda St., through the pedestrian shared space. Continue past Glebe Park and the Casino right through to Constitution Ave.
- TURN RIGHT at Constitution Ave.
- TURN RIGHT at London Circuit.
- <u>TURN RIGHT at Northbourne Ave</u>. BE AWARE this is a 40kmh zone until you reach Barry Drive.

Follow Northbourne Ave to <u>Macarthur Ave, then TURN RIGHT toward Ainslie</u>. Cross Majura Ave to arrive at the Ainslie Football Club.

ADVENTURES IN AUSTIN 7s AND OTHER CARS 1959-1961 JIM APPLEBY

Needless to say, Austin 7s were not the only daily drivers which would now be considered "interesting". For example, in 1960 Ian Willmott learned to drive in his 1927 Model T Ford which became his daily driver. He was refused a driving test at one station because "That's a semi-automatic and you have to get your licence on a manual". None of us CACMC members who have ever driven a Model T would have much illusion that there was anything faintly automatic about driving it.

When the Ford Falcon first came on the market the Model T towed an old dunny can in the Easter procession with a sign reading "Ford from tin can to foulcan". No one had ever heard of "Political Correctness". Alec McKernan had a Mercedes diesel for a short time until he got his first VW Beetle.

Three of us had a Commer, a Hillman and Jim Appleby's 1949 Prefect that all had identical ignition keys No MRN17. The Vanguard dealer had a board with all of the "MRN" series keys available as spares in his parts deparment. There were only 100 keys in the series MRN 00 to MRN 99 so there could have been a lot of English cars and maybe even grey Ferguson tractors, that had identical keys. The Commer and Hillman had matching door and ignition keys but Jim Appleby's Prefect was more secure with different door and ignition keys giving 5,000 possible pairs of key combinations. Maybe car thieves were more honest in those days.

The 1949 Prefect had a solid steel bumper bar which allowed Jim to tow Eddie Choi in a later Prefect 100E the 55 miles from Pyramid Hill to Bendigo when he broke down at my home one weekend. The rope did not break until we were almost there. Needless to say ¾ of the trip was on almost dead flat road.

Until about 1960 Victorian law required the tail light switch to be on the back of the car, so that you had to get out to switch the tail lights ON and check that they worked. This was not popular on a cold wet night nor when you forgot to turn them OFF and flattened the battery.

Dick Lees had a boat tailed Austin 7 Meteor followed by Morris Cowley "Bullnose" (does anyone remember two wheel brakes and putting your arm out the window to make a hand signal when stopping or turning) Dick then had a Lancia Lambda followed by a 3 litre Bentley. We could tell when he was coming in to night school by the "bark" of the Bentley as he changed down gears to go around the Brian Boru hotel corner. David Monotti, Bruce Every and Athol Campbell also had Lancia Lambdas, which from 1922 were about the first cars to use monocoque construction instead of a separate chassis and independent front suspension.

Athol Campbell later had a Lancia Aprilia, made from 1937 to '49. The designers could not fit the generator behind the radiator so they simply formed an opening in the radiator and mounted the generator ahead of the radiator with a drive shaft poking through. The deputy principal had a Borgward Hansa station wagon which was near new then but would be very interesting now if you could get one.

Herbert C (Jock) Jones had a 1934 Dodge with a boot very neatly grafted to the back of the body so that you could not tell that it was an addition. He taught us "Heat Engines" and Applied Mechanics and how to calculate with a "Hemmi" bamboo slide rule and a cylindrical slide rule and how to read "Callender's steam tables". He conducted demonstrations and experiments in the Heat Engines laboratory and took us to the Central Deborah Gold Mine to crawl through the boiler to study its construction. He also refereed our football matches.

The chief motor mechanics instructor Rex Argus had a well maintained 1934 Buick. He patiently explained to me that there were two ways of tightening up the front wheel bearings and he thought that his way was OK because the Buick had already done over 600, 000 km on the one set of wheel bearings. Ken Osborne had a green Vanguard ute that he was very proud of. He drove it from Bendigo to Kyabram for Alec McKernan's 21st which was just over 60 years ago. He also took it to Melbourne when we went on an excursion to inspect various industries. Several of us rode all around Melbourne for several days, in the back of it very happily and legally. Belts were used at the time to keep your trousers up, not to keep you secured to your seat in a vehicle.

During the same excursion Alec's VW beetle ran out of petrol on Prince's Bridge inbound to the city in peak hour after travelling about 250 m from our accommodation at the YMCA, where Crown Casino is now. Fortunately VW beetles at the time had no fuel gauge but they had a tap on the floor that brought the reserve petrol supply into service and gave you time to fill up. VW drivers just got used to filling up about every 160 km.

We had to leave early but extra drives and events were enjoyed by participants over the next two days.






