CACMC CLUB SANCTIONED EVENTS

Club sanctioned events:

You will notice some events listed on page 14 have a # in the title. This means they are a club sanctioned event where members participation is being sought. These go under club runs in your log book.

A member may advise the club (best the Registrar or Secretary) if they wish to participate in any other club event, be it local or interstate. The club official records that participation and the member may then record the participation under a club event, provided the route to/from (more appropriately for interstate events) is mostly direct.

The operator may choose to use a combination of club and private use entitlements, an outline of which should be advised to the club officials before departure. Obviously for a rally over long distances, club entitlement is appropriate.

If operators wish to combine an interstate club event with a period of private use, that is also permitted under the system principles. Integrity and common sense are required as any seeming abuse will impact the entire historic vehicle community.

MEMBERS PLEASE NOTE: YOU MUST HAVE A LOG BOOK OTHERWISE IT IS ILLEGAL TO TAKE YOUR VEHICLE ON THE ROAD.

President

Clarification of membership status of CACMC Family Member named partners.

The Council of ACT Motor Clubs has recently amended its By-laws to clarify that only Full Members of an affiliated club are eligible to be sponsored by a club to register a vehicle under the Conditional Registration Scheme.

CACMC has decided to clarify, in our own By-laws, that a Named Partner in a CACMC family membership is a Full Member of our club and is listed on our register of members.

The amended text of our By-law that describes a Family Membership is as

follows:

"2.2.2 A Family Member is entitled to the rights of an Ordinary Member. The Named Partner of a Family Member is a full financial member, entitled to a separate membership badge, a separate vote at any meeting, to participate individually in any CACMC activity (including subsidised activities), to participate in the Concessional Registration Scheme, and to hold office within CACMC in their own right."

Full text of all By-laws is available on CACMC website.

Council report

October 2025 Council Report Roger Amos.

President:

Still waiting for The Secretary to get a Quote from Thoroughbred Park regarding use of that facility for Wheels 2026. Believes there is an issue with Wheels being sponsored by Famous Insurance Brokers and Thoroughbred Park having their own insurance.

Vice President:

Asks if clubs can let the council know of any events they are organising or have heard about so council can be kept up to date of events. Otherwise we cannot put the details on the website

Events:

Saturday 6th Dec 25: 100 Years of Ford. The PFV (Ford Performance Vehicles) Club has cancelled the planned event for 100 years of Ford. The Ford GT club has organised with Ollies Garage to hold the event as an Ollies Garage open day plus cars in the parking area outside.

Registrar:

The Licensing and Registration Administration (LARA) website sometimes allows on line renewal of CRS registration without uploading Certificate of Inspection Forms. If this happens to you just send the Certificate of Inspection to the LARA email address. You can also renew in person at the shopfront or by post.

A member of an affiliate club has not used their vehicle in conjunction with the rules. It involved usage in excess of the 60 days and non-compliance with logbook requirements. Dave will forward all the information collated to the RTA with a recommendation from the Committee that some form of penalty be imposed.

The MOU between the ACT Government and the CACTMC is being updated to align the new titles of relevant Government agencies. Main points are;

CRS (Concessional Registration Scheme) now stands for Conditional Registration System instead of Concessional.

Currently allows similar engines to be fitted for restorations where original is no longer available (e.g. Morris Minors can have a Toyota engine of same power and size fitted) as long as there is no power augmentation, i.e. turbo.

Updates to MOU will include a generic provision for another engine where a manufacturer offered optional engines for the same body in a production run.

CTP (Compulsory Third Party) to be renamed MAI (Major Accident Insurance) to align with NSW.

All other aspects and operation of the system remain unchanged.

The Registrar will update the By Laws to incorporate changes in the MOU.

The club "Nobodies" have been granted access to Conditional Registration Scheme.

Message for Registrars/ Compliance Inspectors;

When completing registration renewal check, ensure the log book for;

Car Odometer reading equates to logbook entries (approximate).

Page 5 Club membership is completed and signed by club official.

General Business:

The President advised that the Committee will examine the matter of annual fees and report back to the Council.

HSV club was looking at running a car show near Questacon. Costs included \$2000 venue hire and each car needs a drip tray even though it is a public carpark plus about \$7,000 for Traffic management. Council agrees the Government is too expensive and too hard to deal with and even Queanbeyan costs have been going up.

Venues suggested for running a car show included Hall Showgrounds, Deakin Football Club, Tuggeranong Homestead and the Spanish Club. These seem to be able to cover the expensive Public Liability Insurance with no cost to the car clubs.
