1930 BUICK SPORTS ROADSTER HOLDEN BODY, SERIES 40

(40 produced)

At present the Roadster is owned by the BOYCE family. A fourth generational touch is from Edward great grandfather (*to Graham*) and engineer of yesteryear from Kiama, NSW. The right hand windscreen spot light belonged to him which he had on his daily driver car a 'T' Model Ford and then his 1927 Capital Chevrolet (*in which he taught Barry to drive*).

The Roadster was purchased as a pile of junk from Sutton Forest, NSW. The former owner was Roy Elbourn, a Vietnam Veteran. He acquired the car from his brother when he was just a boy. He decided to restore it at some stage and pulled it apart and that's how it remained for many years, with the body lying on its side in the dirt. It was during that stage he bought a 1930 Federal Phaeton Buick from Fairfield, Sydney, NSW. This car was bought intact, driving it home for spare parts for the Roadster.

The negotiated price by Barry, father to Graham, was \$200 for the two cars in 1977. A team effort and flotilla of cars were required to retrieve the vehicles from their resting place and transport them back to Canberra.

The Roadster being the worst for wear was first cab off the rank to be restored. Easy to say achieving it is another. The Phaeton at the time was used as examples of how things should go together. Well many, many mistakes were made, frustration was common and the walk away factor was exercised but what was needed the most was determination and eventually the Roadster emerged.

The hood irons were fabricated together and riveted by club member the late Allan Sugden. The wood/coach work in the body frame was completed by the late Wally Brown. The upholstery was made and fitted by the late Bill Phillips. Leather work and Buick inscriptions were imported from overseas.

The restoration was completed in 1982 after some five years of mechanical work, panel beating, extensive rust repairs, spray painting, electrical and upholstery framing carried out by us. Teacher and mentor for me to panel beat is Peter Arber my cousin who is an old school panel beater who file finishes panels.

The chrome plating and polishing was done by Electroplating Technology, Queanbeyan. Shane, the chrome plater (knowledge plus) and Brett, the wizard who changes a sow's ear into a silk purse.

In 2005 the Roadster survived a double brick garage roof implosion in a storm. It survived as it was parked between my 1948 Chevrolet Coupe and Sedan. They came out the worst for wear - heart breaking mess as both at the time were restored. (And congratulations to you for picking yourselves up and re-restoring them. Ed)

All in all it was meant to be a 'hand me down toy' which will be in the BOYCE family for many years to come.

The Roadster a treasure for us but also to old good friends past and present, a tribute to the skills of those who helped along the journey of restoring the Buick.

My mates who have influenced me are Albert Neuss, Keith Harvey, Peter Withers, Shane Moore, Peter Arber, Roy Munn, Keith Blundell, John Thomas, Bob Harris, Bill Phillips.

Club member Jim Crane has been building model cars, trains, ships and airplanes for around 50 years.

'I like the Formula 1 models best of all, I will never be able to own a real one, so modeling is next best thing to me,' he said.

His collection of mainly 1/12 scale, includes a 1/8 scale 1930s Mercedes Benz, which Jim said was the most difficult to build because of the amount of detail it contained, right down to the last degree, 'It was a pain to construct, but wonderful to look at when it was finished,' he said.

Next most difficult was an Alfa Romeo, which when you turn the crank handle, the pistons go up and down.

Jim's favorite model however, is his 1/12 Lotus 49 driven by Jim Clark, who he believes was head and shoulders above the rest of the F1 drivers of his time. Jim admits to being a fan of Clarks, not only because they share the same initials.

It takes Jim between six and eight weeks to finish a model. ' I only work on them at night,' he said.

While he has never raced himself, except once when he and three other Canberra Antique and Classic Motor Club members went to Wakefield Park to try out his Nota. He claims to have had the second fastest Austin A30 in Sydney in 1957 /58.

The unsinkable RMS *TITANIC* sank off the Newfoundland coast in 1912 with a huge loss of life.

It was at that time the greatest sea disaster of its time and the exact location of the wreck was not discovered until the late 1980s.
